First shipments of applications for 1938 automobile licenses left Springfield Oct. 30. for distribution throughout the State. The first of but. these were sent to city and county clerks, sheriffs, notaries public, police stations, and newspapers, and motor clubs.

Motorists wishing to retain the numbers which were issued them in 1937 must specifycally request reassignment prior to Dec. 1, 1937. After this date no numbers are kept back in favor of their present hold-
