

Dr. R. W. Hartness Appointed Education Head in Lake Forest

The Rev. Robert W. Hartness, Ph. D., recently assumed the duties of director of religious education at the First Presbyterian church, Lake Forest. A reception and tea was held in compliment to him from 3:30 o'clock to 5:30 on Sunday afternoon. Parents of children in the church school and members of the congregation attended to meet Mr. and Mrs. Hartness.

The new director was graduated from the University of Oklahoma and taught school for three years. From there he came here to the Presbyterian Theological seminary, was graduated in three years, took a church pastorate, and later returned to the seminary for a degree in religious education.

Gets Degree from Yale
He next attended Yale university to take special work in the field of education. He was granted the degree of doctor of philosophy from Yale in 1936, and for the last year and a half has been a district chaplain for CCC camps, with six other chaplains under his direction. He was stationed at Long Lake, Wis.

Dr. Hartness is an ordained member of the Presbyterian church and a member of the Presbytery of Chicago. While doing research work at the seminary he was on the staff of the Second Presbyterian church for two years.

Waldo M. Allen, superintendent of the church school, is head of the committee which obtained the services of Dr. Hartness, and he and his teaching staff will work in co-operation with the new director.

Dr. and Mrs. Hartness and their small daughter will make their home at 1546 Willow road, Lake Forest.

Their home for the past two years while Dr. Hartness was in CCC work, was in Deerfield.

Commerce College Graduation Program In Waukegan Dec. 3

On Friday, December 3, graduates of the 1936-37 class of the Lake College of Commerce will gather at the American Legion Home in Waukegan for the annual graduation banquet. The first course will be served at 6:30.

Professor A. C. Tomlinson, instructor of public speaking at the Lake Forest university, will deliver the main address. He has chosen as his subject, "Lost Horizons." Mr. Tomlinson will also be remembered for his interesting night school classes at Lake College which will be resumed the first of the year. As usual, the ever-popular toastmaster will be Glenn G. Hoskins, vice-president of the Foulds Milling Company of Libertyville. This will make his sixth consecutive appearance in that capacity for the school; and, like an old friend, his cleverness in handling the situations brings an even greater ovation.

The will and prophecy will not be given as in previous years. As a result a very different form of entertainment will be presented. The program will be based on the theme of "Harbor Lights." A novel feature of the entertainment will be a song written around the class motto, "Trim Your Sails for Success." John Mahnich, president of this year's class, wrote the music, and the artists in its presentation will include Dorothy Herrick of Milburn, Vivienne Bush of Great Lakes, and Marion Beere of Highland Park.

The presentation of diplomas, will conclude the program, and eighty-five graduates will receive these from Mr. P. W. Pettengill, president of the school. At this time individual honors will be given to the best students in various specialized commercial subjects. Dancing will complete the evening.

More Firemen Lose Lives Enroute Than At Actual Scene

Statistics show that more firemen lose their lives going to and from fires than at the scene of operations, says the Chicago Motor club, and the blame for these deaths may often be placed directly upon the actions of careless motorists.

"Chasing fire engines not only endangers the lives of firemen," asserts Charles M. Hayes, president of the Motor club, "but is a direct violation of the law. It also results in traffic snarls which delays fire-fighting equipment in transit."

The state vehicle code specifies that the driver of any vehicle shall yield the right of way to fire engines at all times and requires that the operator of the vehicle shall pull over to the side of the roadway as close to right-hand curbing as possible and clear of any intersection, and remain there until the fire engines have passed. Police cars and ambulances also are entitled to the same consideration.

The law also prohibits any vehicle from following any fire apparatus traveling in response to a fire alarm closer than 500 feet, or parking such vehicle within the block when the apparatus has stopped for the fire.

Do You Know Illinois

Q. Who was the Speaker of the House of the 2nd General Assembly?
A. John McLean of Gallatin.

Q. What were the expenditures of the 2nd General Assembly?
A. The members received \$3.50 per day and mileage and \$97.50 were spent for stationery.

Q. What was McLean's action on the State Bank Bill?
A. By the rules he was not allowed to vote except in case of a tie or a meeting as a committee of the whole. The house refused to meet and McLean resigned his position and on the floor gave a powerful argument against the bill in which he predicted all the evils which ultimately resulted from the operations of the bank.

Q. How much money was circulated by the State Bank?
A. \$300,000. Silver being scarce the bills even were cut to serve as fractional currency.

Q. What was the ultimate result of the State Bank law?
A. The cost to the State was at least equal to the amount issued by the bank.

Q. Was a duel ever fought in Illinois after it became a State?
A. Yes, in 1820 William Bennett fought and killed Alphonso Stewart.

Q. What happened to Bennett?
A. Gov. Bond refused executive clemency and Bennett was hanged before a large crowd.

Q. What position did Gov. Bond take after the expiration of his term in 1822?
A. He was again appointed to the office of register of the land office, at that time the most lucrative position in the State, the salary being \$3,000.

Q. Did Bond ever run for office again?
A. In 1824 he ran for Congress from Crawford County against Daniel P. Cook. Cook won by a vote of 7,460 to 4,374.

Q. When did Bond die?
A. April 12, 1832. In 1881 his remains were removed to Chester by the State and a monument erected over his grave.
