

**Momberg Pleads Not Guilty to Manslaughter Charge**

Harry Momberg, 26, of Rockford, pleaded not guilty to two manslaughter charges in circuit court Monday just a few minutes after two suits for \$10,000 each were started against him by the First National Bank of Waukegan, as administrator of the estates of Arthur Orsi and his wife, Lucille, who were fatally injured in an automobile accident on Thanksgiving Day.

When arraigned before Judge Ralph J. Dady, Momberg entered a plea of not guilty to the two indictments charging him with manslaughter for the death of Orsi and his wife. He was represented by Attorney Frank Daly. Unable to post bail, he was remanded to the county jail pending trial.

In the civil suits filed by the administrator through Attorney J. A. Miller, it is alleged that Momberg was at fault for the automobile collision at Deerfield road and Central avenue, Highland Park, on Nov. 25. The Orsis were riding with their two-year-old son, Roland, at the time of the accident. The boy was uninjured.

Both Joseph and Lucille Orsi are issue for the estates of the Orsis and the surviving child.

Charles Brehm, William Yonke and Cecil Aikens, all of Zion, named in three true bills for forgery and false pretenses, were remanded to the county jail after arraignments before Judge Dady. Attorney Wesley Carey was appointed by the court to defend Brehm and Aikens. Yonke pleaded not guilty through Attorney Daly and was held for trial.

**Tom Russell, Jr. Named Collector by Highwood Council**

At a meeting of the Highwood City Council last Wednesday, Thomas Russell, Jr., who has been acting city collector of Highwood since the death of Paul Blum in October, was appointed to fill the vacancy caused by Blum's death.

Russell, who is better known among the young set here, is the son of Thomas Russell, city clerk. He is 25 years old and is probably the youngest city official in this part of the state.

In addition to his duties as city collector he is also assistant city clerk of the water department.

**Russian Nobleman Becomes U. S. Citizen**

A Russian nobleman forsook his high ranking Monday and became just an average American citizen along with 54 others who were granted full naturalization rights by Judge Ralph J. Dady in circuit court.

The former nobleman, Nicholas Starosselsky, of 605 College road, Lake Forest, is now a sales manager for the midwestern branch of a perfumery. He is the husband of the former Mrs. Alice Bodiger Boswell, who won a Reno divorce from Roland Boswell, the broker, in 1927.

Starosselsky will join the other 54 newly admitted citizens at a reception to be held Monday at 8 p. m. at the American Legion Home, Washington and West streets, by patriotic organizations. Certificates of citizenship will be issued by Circuit Clerk L. J. Wilmot to those who passed the naturalization tests.
