"God" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, January 2.

The Golden Text was, "Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary: who is so great a God as our God? (Psalms 77:13).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else" (Isaiah 45:22).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science Textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "The starting-point of divine Science is that God, Spirit, is All-in-all, and that there is no other might nor Mind—that God is Love, and therefore He is divine Principle. To grasp the reality and order of being in its Science, you must begin by reckoning God as the divine Principle of all that really is, Spirit, Life, Truth, Love, combine as one,—and are the Scriptural names for God" (p. 275).
