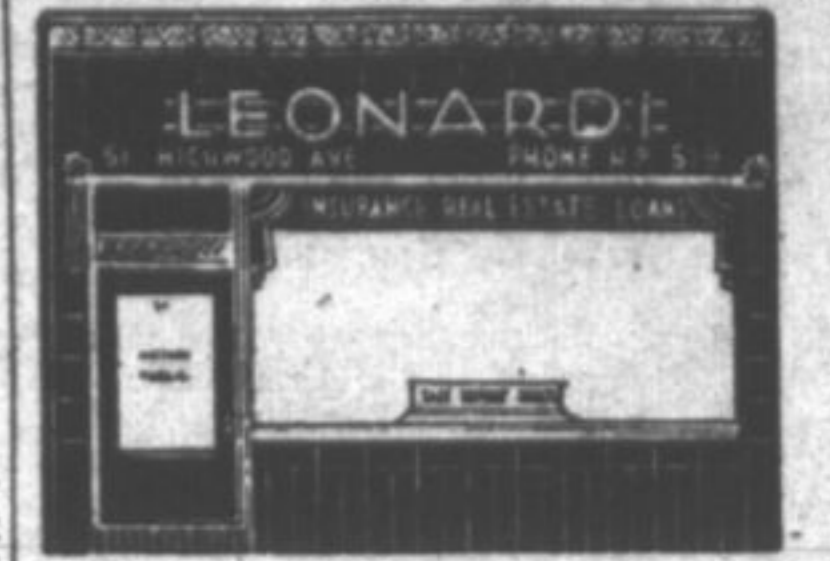
Lady Elks Plan Party For Feb. 1

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING ON WAUKEGAN ROAD BETWEEN OSTERMAN AVENUE AND ORCHARD STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD: SECTION 1. That on Waukegan Road between Osterman Avenue and Orchard Street no motor vehicle shall be parked with the left side of such vehicle next to the curb, and it shall be unlawful to stand or park any vehicle within the above described limits other than parallel with the curb and with the right wheels of the vehicle within twelve inches of the regularly established curb line. SECTION 2. That the driver of any vehicle shall not park such vehicle for longer than ninety minutes at any time between eight o'clock A.M. and eight o'clock P.M. on Waukegan Road between Osterman Avenue and Orchard Street in the Village of Deerfield, Lake County, Illinois. SECTION 3. That signs or markers giving notice of the parking regulations hereby established shall be erected and maintained in each block in the above designated portion of Waukegan Road. SECTION 4. SECTION 5. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. SECTION 6.
