

P. S. Scully Dies; Buried Wednesday

Philip S. Scully, aged 68, passed away Monday at his home in Chicago following a year's illness of heart trouble.

Until a year ago, when he left Deerfield to go to Arizona in the hope of regaining his health, he had been a resident of this village for 16 years.

Since 1893 he had been an employee of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad, serving as an engineer. He was retired a year ago when his health failed him. He was a member of Deerfield Lodge No. 1110 A. F. and A. M. and Veteran Employee's association, C. M. & St. P. R. R.

Funeral services were held yesterday (Wednesday) afternoon at two o'clock from the funeral home at 3429 Fullerton avenue, Chicago. Interment was in Ridgewood cemetery.

Besides his wife, Hattie Longworth, he is survived by seven children, Elizabeth Stace, Adelaide Steiner, Philip, Jr., Edgar, Le Roy, Margaret Houser and Jean, and two sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Portis and Mrs. Nellie Stevens.
