Army Deserters Are Captured In Chicago; Admit 200 Robberies

Kidnaping will not be one of the many charges lodged against two army deserters from Fort Sheridan, who are in the custody of Chicago police after confessing to 200 hold-ups since Thanksgiving.

Capt. T. G. Holland, Fort Sheridan provost marshal, said that prosecution of the enlisted men, Richard Boehler Jr., 25, of Chicago, and Matthew Douglas, 26, of Pocahontas, will be entirely in the state's hands.

Thus the two soldiers will escape court martial for alleged abduction and robbery of a CCC captain near Marseilles, Ill., on Dec. 1; theft of army automatics, and for desertion. The men, however, will receive dishonorable discharges from the army.

Boehler was arrested Saturday by Chicago police, who were assigned to apprehend two ex-soldiers sought in connection with 200 robberies.

Detectives noticed an automobile with Michigan license plates and listed as stolen parked in front of 6046 Woodland avenue.

The officers let the air out of the tires and then waited until Boehler

attempted to inflate them. Following his arrest, he was taken by police to the Woodlawn avenue apartment.

While there, detectives intercepted a telegram from Douglas, who had gone to Kansas City. A communication sent there resulted in Douglas's apprehension. He has been extradited to Illinois.

Both men, according to Lieut. Walter Storms of the Chicago police, admitted pouring their \$40,000 loot into Chicago night club life. One of their more recent hold-ups, they confessed, was the \$1,400 robbery two weeks ago of the Tower Finance Corp. Eighteen employees were locked in a vault.

Three Chicago men, employees of a drug store, food store, and cigar store, yesterday identified Boehler as one of the two bandits who held up their establishments during the past seven weeks.
