

Citizens Committee Announces Several New Appointments

Preliminary to the intensified program for community safety to be conducted in Highland Park during the year, Edwin Gilroy, chairman of the Highland Park Citizens Safety Committee, announces the first of several appointments of leading citizens who will take an active part.

Chairman Gilroy has forwarded letters to all local organizations inviting them to re-enroll their organization and name their representative and alternate for the year.

Most important of the new appointments are those of Major Frank Ronan who will be chairman of the Annual Safety Week Program; Edw. M. Steele of the Park Board as chairman of the new City Safety Ordinance Committee, and of Miss Minnie Buzard, principal of Highland Park High school, who will serve as chairman of the committee to coordinate the program of greater school safety.

Two valuable contributions to greater local safety made during the past week were the installation of new and more powerful lights on the Highland Park North Shore station and at the crossing of Central and St. Johns avenues.

Another worthwhile contribution made recently was the announcement by the Dumaresq Spencer Post of the American Legion that they will furnish white rubber rain coats and hats for the safety patrol boys at the schools.

Former Lake Forest Plumber Ends Life

Despondency over ill health caused James Peter Martinek, 69, a retired plumber, to hang himself Wednesday afternoon in the basement of his home at 46 N. Washington circle, Lake Forest.

This was the verdict of a coroner's jury in an inquest conducted by Coroner John L. Taylor in Lake Forest.

With a rope tied around his neck, Martinek was discovered dead by his son-in-law, John M. Leonard, with whom he lived at the Lake Forest address.

Tying one end of a rope around a pipe and the other around his neck, Martinek jumped off a ladder sometime yesterday afternoon. He had been in ill health for some time.

Besides his daughter, Mrs. John M. Leonard, he is survived by another daughter, Mrs. Edwin Baldwin of Lake Forest, and a son, Cyril, of Highland Park.

F.H.A. Conference To Be Discussed At Real Estate Meet
