To School Patrons:
A school election is not a place for factional strife and the group associated with me is not political in any sense.

It was their thought that there should be more than seven representatives from the community from which to select a board.

In view of the recent report of the excellent condition of the Deerfield Grammar School made by the State Department of Public Instruction, there is no need for hasty action on any problem at this time.

The following group has offered to run for election. You know them all; they need no introduction of biographical sketch; their qualifications are obvious.

For Members—Milton Olson, Glenn Briscoe, E. G. Jacobson, Homer Cazal, T. G. Johnson, Mrs. Donald Easton.

The members of this group present a reasonable and easily-understood point of view. They agree on the pledge to:

- 1—Maintain and improve the standards.
- 2—Fair treatment to teachers and employees.
- 3—Give all problems unprejudiced consideration.

It is their hope that the voters themselves will mark their ballots with unprejudiced judgment for the good of the school and the pupils who attend it.

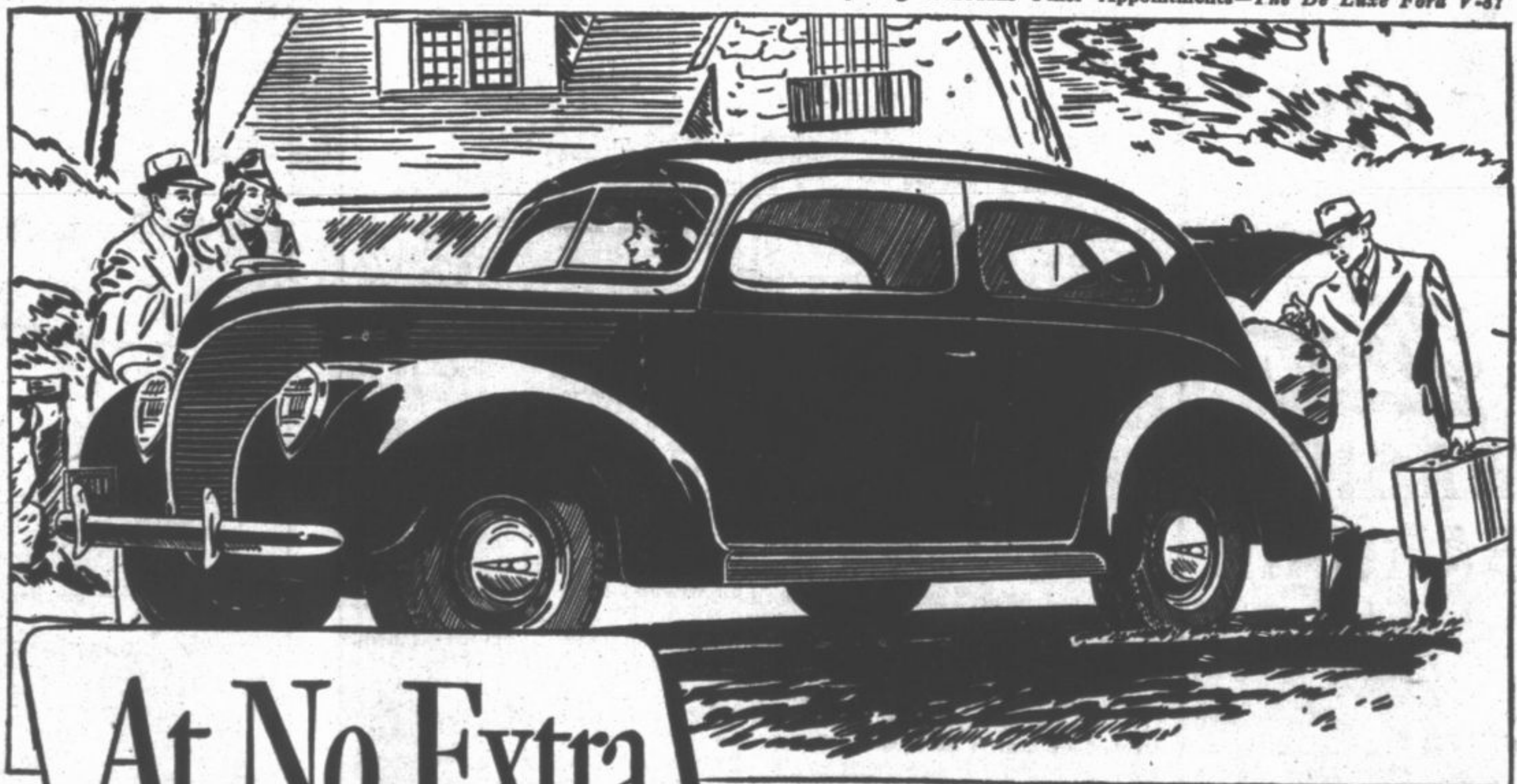
