However, most quaint and interesting is a little pamphlet published in 1837 called The Temperance Cook Book compiled by a Lady of Philadelphia for the use of those persons who wish to exclude spirituous liquors from their cookery. Two of the most unusual recipes read: Blamange-Boil two ounces of isinglass in three pints of water, boil it half an hour, strain and add to it half a pint of cream, sweeten and put some bitter almonds in it, let it boil up, let it settle before pouring it into your forms.

Syllabub-Sweeten a quart of cream with loaf-sugar, grate nutmeg into it, milk your cow into the liquor very fast, that it may be very frothy. This is very good for evening entertainments etc.

Take a pint of cream, grate in the skin of a lemon, beat the whites of three eggs, sweeten until light, put into your syllabub glasses.
