Cookery, New and Old There is a fad for new cook books of all sorts and kinds. Publishing companies vie with each other in offering new and attractive cook books.

However, most quaint and interesting is a little pamphlet published in 1837 called The Temperance Cook Book compiled by a Lady of Philadelphia for the use of those persons who wish to exclude spirituous liquors from their cookery.
