

Haessler Dancers In Program At Ravinia June 4th

The annual dance program presented by the pupils of Mildred Haessler is announced for Saturday afternoon and evening, June 4, at the Ravinia auditorium.

A cast of 80 girls from North Shore homes and the Park Ridge School for Girls will take part.

Two ballet pantomime numbers, the Toy Shop and the Enchanted Lake, will head the program, followed by several toe and tap numbers, a Russian section, and a Strauss waltz scene.

The exhibition is in the nature of a benefit for the Park Ridge school recreation department where Mildred Haessler has been contributing her services as dance instructor for several years. Proceeds will be used to install bars for ballet and gymnastic dancing in the school gymnasium and to buy tap-dancing shoes for the rest of the 90 girls taking work in the dance courses.

The Park Ridge school was founded after the Civil War to house and educate girl war orphans and has continued to train dependent girls ever since.

North Shore pupils of Mildred Haessler who will appear in the program come from Highland Park, Highwood, Ravinia and Brae-side homes.

The dance program with its fairy tale atmosphere has been a standard entertainment feature for North Shore children for many years. During the Ravinia Summer Opera season in past years the program was regularly produced as part of a Children's Afternoon series at Ravinia Park.

Highwood Auxiliary To Sell Poppies Monday, May 23rd

An appeal for general wearing of the memorial poppy in remembrance of the World War dead on Poppy Day, Monday, May 23rd, was issued today by Mrs. Ray Suzzi, president of the Stupey-Smith unit of the Highwood American Legion Auxiliary. She asked that every person in Highwood pay honor to the men of the city and of the nation who gave their lives in defense of the country by wearing a poppy on Poppy Day.

"The poppy is the individual tribute to the memory of the men who died in World War service," said Mrs. Suzzi. "Everyone can wear a poppy to show that he remembers and is grateful for the gallant sacrifices made for American security and democracy. Every patriotic citizen will take part in the observance of Poppy Day."

"The poppy is the symbol of the supreme sacrifice. It stands for the highest type of patriotism we can conceive. Wearing this little flower awakens in our hearts a deeper conception of our duties to our country. It reminds us that life itself is not too much to give if our country is in danger and gives us inspiration to serve in peace with the same spirit of patriotic devotion that inspired those who died among the poppies of France."

Members of the Auxiliary will distribute poppies on the streets all day Monday, receiving in exchange for them contributions for the Legion and Auxiliary Welfare work among the disabled veterans and needy families of veterans.
