**Mrs. Mary McClure New President of Green Bay P.T.A.**

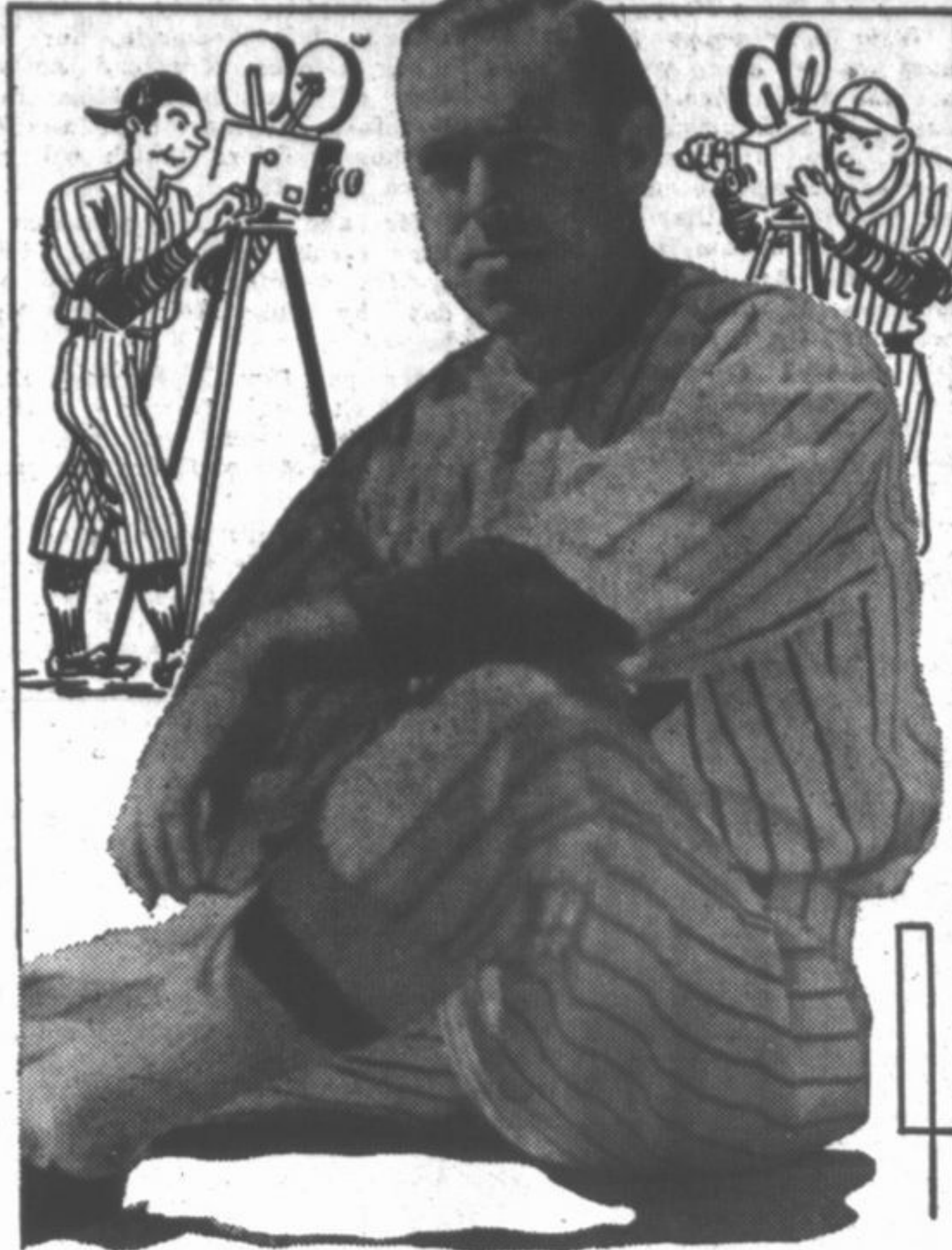
