ORDINANCE LICENSING AND REGU-LATING PEDDLERS IN THE CITY OF HIGHWOOD, LAKE COUNTY, ILLI-BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUN-CIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHWOOD:

SECTION 1. DEFINITION: A PEDDLER That for the purpose of this Ordinance a peddler shall be deemed to be any person peddler shall be deemed to be any person who shall sell or offer for sale, barter, or exchange at retail, books, pictures, photographs, goods, wares or merchandise, magazines, oil, wood, fruits, vegetables, butter, poultry, fish or country produce, travelling from place to place on, along or upon the streets or alleys of the City, or at doors of houses or apartments, or who shall sell and deliver such articles from any vehicle going from place to place or who shall go about in the City selling and delivering such articles or offering the same for sale and carrying the article offered with him.

The above definition shall not be construed to apply to any person selling vegetables, fruits, berries, poultry or other products of their own farms or premises, but shall include any person who buys any part

shall include any person who buys any part thereof offered for sale, from others. SECTION 2 LICENSE. That every person who desires to peddle in the City of Highwood, shall first procure a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 3.

APPLICATION. That every person desiring such license shall make application in writing therefor to the City Collector giving full information as may be required upon the application blank, to be furnished by such Collector, and state the full name, residence, age, type of work applicant expect to engage in, for whom applicant is selling, character reference and shall de-

posit a license fee.

Before said license shall issue applicant must go to the Police Department of the City of Highwood, giving the same infor-City of Highwood, giving the same information to said department, and said department shall record the finger prints of each applicant together with the photograph to be furnished by such applicant. No license shall issue before the expiration of three days unless the Police Department shall sooner be able to check the character, qualifications and record of such applicant. If same is found to be in proper order the department shall then approve a card, to same is found to be in proper order the department shall then approve a card, to be furnished by the City Collector, bearing a photograph of the applicant similar to the one on file in the Police Department, such license shall be signed by the City Collector and the City Marshal of the City.

This permission or license shall in no way be recommendation for any article or thing, tangible or intensible which such

thing, tangible or intangible which such peddler may have to offer the publica SECTION 4. FEE. That the fee for a peddler using cart, wagon, auto or any other vehicle shall be fifty dollars for each eart or other vehicle for a yearly license; twenty-five dollars for each car or other vehicle for a monthly license, and five dollars for each cart or vehicle for a daily license. The fee for peddlers not using any vehicle shall be twenty dollars for a yearly license; ten dollars for a monthly license, and three dollars for a

daily license. PERMIT TO BE CARRIED. Upon satisfactory evidence being submitted to the City Marshall that applicant is a fit, proper per-son to engage in such business as peddler, son to engage in such business as peddler, and upon the payment of the fee as here-inbefore provided, there shall be issued to the applicant a permit in a form to be approved by the City Collector and the City Marshall, which form shall bear the signatures of these officers and a photograph of said person to whom permit is issued. Applicant to the statement of the said person to whom permit is issued. plicant shall then be permitted to engage in his business in the City of Highwood for such time as is provided for in his per-

EXHIBITING PERMIT. Every holder of a permit under this Chapter shall exhibit the same at the request of any Police Of-ficer or any citizen of the City of High-wood, and shall immediately upon making contact with a prospect in the City, exhibit such permit and properly identify himself.
SECTION 7.
GENERAL PROVISIONS. That the City

Marshall may make such investigation of each and every applicant as he may deem proper and if in his opinion a longer time than is provided for in this Ordinance is required he shall be at liberty to refuse to Central & Second St. Tel. P. 2774 be guilty of any fraud, cheating, or misrepresentation, either through himself or through an employee while acting as a peddler in the City; or who shall barter, or sell or peddle any goods, wares, or merchandise other than those specified in his application for a license shall be fined not less than Five Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars for each offense, and the mayor may revoke his license for such offense,

SECTION 9. NOISE. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to shout, sing, call, or to make any loud noise by mechanical or other device, or by any means whatever, for the purpose of attracting attention to himself, or to his
