Will Of Mrs. Barnes Probated Last Week

The will of Mrs. Alice Reid Barnes, wife of Clifford W. Barnes, of Lake Forest, president of the Sunday Evening club, was filed Thursday in the Probate court of Lake county at Waukegan.

Mrs. Barnes left an estate esti-

mated at \$500,000, the bulk of which was bequeathed to her husband. After his death it will go to her daughter, Miss Lilace Reid Barnes. Several other bequests were made including one of jewelry and personal belongings to Miss Barnes.

Mrs. Barnes' will also disposed of a \$100,000 trust fund left her by her father, Simon Reid, founder of Reid-Murdoch. This amount was put in trust for the Visiting Nurses association, the Young Women's Christian association and the Sunday Evening club, in bequests of \$37,000, \$37,000 and \$26,000 respectively.

An Illinois Metropolis

Visions of a great center of population in southern Illinois that would be an important gateway between the North and the South led to the founding in 1839 of Metropolis in Massac county on the Ohio river shore. The name, which means "mother city" or "principal city," reflects the ambitious hopes of its pioneer builders, William A. Beane, Sr., and J. H. G. Wilcox, according to research workers of the Federal Writers' Project, W.P.A.

McBane, who operated a packet boat on the Ohio and the Mississippi rivers, became so much impressed with the site, it is said, that he traded a boat-load of goods for a half interest in a thousand-acre tract of land owned by Wilcox. The tide of population, however, went to Paducah, Ky., close by, and Metropolis developed into a relatively small city that makes up in beauty what it lacks in size. Its population is 5,573.
