# Lake Forest Horse Show To Be Held June 22-25 At Onwentsia

The twenty-sixth annual Lake Forest Horse Show which benefits the Lake Forest Hospital Association (Alice Home) will be held at Onwentsia Country Club beginning Wednesday, June 22, and closing Saturday, June 25. The Lake Forest show has gained an enviable position among the leading shows of the United States and the current edition promises to outdo all previous shows.

Among the outstanding events in a program that is not complete as yet are the military jumping events in which the Canadian Governor-General's Horse Guards team will appear. Competing against the Canadians will be the 124th Field Artillery, Fort Leavenworth's cavalry team, and the representatives of Fort Sheridan. Lieut-Col. A. E. Nash of the Canadian team and Col. Charles H. Hafner of the 124th Field Artillery, have both offered trophies for the winner of the military jumping events.

Judges include: Mrs. William C. Cox of Cohasset, Mass.; Lewis E. Waring of Rumson, New Jersey; Richard F. Caywood of North Middleton, Ky.; Henry L. Bell of Bay-side, L. I.; Maj-Gen. L. B. Kromer of Washington, D. C., who recently retired as officer in charge of cavalry in the United States Army; and Capt. Earl F. Thompson of Fort Leavenworth, Kas. It is interesting to note that Capt. Thompson is the former Olympic and record holder in the high hurdles. He represented Dartmouth College and took part in several Olympic games.
