Tribune Gives Facts on New Automobile Liability Bill

(Chicago Tribune Press Service.) Springfield, Ill., June 26.—(Special.) - A financial responsibility bill, expected to be enacted with a

drivers license law before the special session is ended here on Thursday night, is simple in its purposes but complicated in its methods of attaining these purposes. Its terms, covering sixteen printed pages, may bewilder many of the 2,700,000 Illinois drivers who will be concerned.

The main purpose of the financial responsibility act, as it is satisfactorily functioning in other states, is to curb recklessness inspired by a knowledge that the driver will not pay for any damages that his recklessness might cause.

Statement on Provisions A simple but incomplete statement of the provisions is this:

When a driver's license has been revoked for one of the more serious traffic offenses his driving license and his auto license are suspended until he establishes proof of his ability to pay for damages in any accident he might cause thereafter. When a motorist is convicted in a civil suit for damages resulting from an automobile accident, his licenses are suspended until the judgment is paid and he establishes proof of his financial responsibility should his carelessness cause a sec-

ond accident. The proposed law, as drafted, offers several means for establishing this proof. However, as the law functions in other states, the usual method is to post a public liability insurance policy. The policy must cover \$5,000 for the injury or death of more than one person, and \$1,000 for property damage.

Insurance Not Compulsory This does not mean that public

liability insurance is to be compulsory. Compulsory insurance has been tried in only one state, Massachusetts, and the results, according to reports, have not been satisfac-

Under the financial responsibility law, insurance is not compulsory until after the motorist has been found guilty of carelessness in a civil suit or has been found guilty of one of the more serious traffic offenses in a criminal prosecution.

A motorist may elect to go without liability insurance, either because the premium would be a hardship or because he does little driv-

If this is his choice, which is permissible under the financial responsibility act, the law places a burden upon him to exercise more than ordinary care. He is restrained by a threat of losing his driving and car licenses for any serious traffic violation, or for any accident damages which he would be unable to

The bill sets up qualifications of these previsions. For the vast majority of motorists, it is sufficient to know they must carry a so-called 5 and 10 insurance policy or they are in danger of being barred from the highways if, resorting to the vernacular their driving gets them into a serious jam.
