In the 100-word rate shorthand, Jeanette Miller of Waukegan, placed second, transcribing her test, which included letters and articles, at the rate of thirty-eight words a minute. Helen Sengenberger of Waukegan placed third in the 130-word rate



shorthand. Competition in these events was exceptionally strong.

While Lake College of Commerce did not receive the division trophy because of its small registrations in the contest, it nevertheless placed second in total points, one point behind the winner. It proves conclusively the excellence of the college's instruction in daily work and the high caliber of its students. Approximately 500 students took part in the various events, and practically every state in the union was represented as well as Canada.
