Attend Educational Conference, Evanston

R. L. Sandwick, superintendent of the Deerfield Shields Township High school, and E. R. Seese, a member of the Board of Education, are participating in panel discussions at the annual Conference for School Administrators, sponsored by the school of education of Northwestern university, which is being held this week, Tuesday to Thursday.

Each year this conference is held during the summer session, to take advantage of the presence of educational leaders who are teaching or studying in Evanston. The theme of the meeting this year will be "Challenging Problems in Educational Administration."

The program includes several addresses and a number of symposia on educational problems. Among the prominent educators who will participate in the program are John Fewkes, president of the Chicago Teachers' union; Malcolm McLean, director of the General college, University of Minnesota; Harold Fawcett of the University school, Ohio State university; and William C. Reavis, professor of education, University of Chicago.

Honore Beere Places Third in Amateur Commercial Contest

The Lake College of Commerce again made an enviable record at the Sixth Annual International Commercial School contest held at the Hotel Sherman in Chicago Tuesday and Wednesday. A decision was made to enter the contest Monday evening, and without the intensive training that generally accompanies this type of work, four out of five contestants from the college who entered, placed.

In the novice typewriting division for business colleges, Dorothy Herrick of Milburn won first place for the event with a speed of seventy-three words per minute. This speed is a composite score of straight typing and letter set-up, the latter including form arrangement and tabulation. Miss Herrick was presented with a beautiful trophy for the school and a gold medal for herself.

In the amateur typewriting division, Honore Beere of Highland Park placed third with a speed of seventy-two. Her test was carried along the same lines as previously mentioned. Miss Beere was awarded a bronze medal for her excellent work.

In the 100-word rate shorthand, Jeanette Miller of Waukegan, placed second, transcribing her test, which included letters and articles, at the rate of thirty-eight words a minute. Helen Sengenberger of Waukegan placed third in the 130-word rate

shorthand. Competition in these events was exceptionally strong.

While Lake College of Commerce did not receive the division trophy because of its small registrations in the contest, it nevertheless placed second in total points, one point behind the winner. It proves conclusively the excellence of the college's instruction in daily work and the high caliber of its students. Approximately 500 students took part in the various events, and practically every state in the union was represented as well as Canada.
