## Summer Training Camps in Full Swing at Fort Sheridan

Brigadier General Karl Truesdell, U.S.A., announced today that the summer training camps at Fort Sheridan, Ill., were well under way, with every indication that a most successful season could be expected. General Truesdell has assigned Major M.A.S. Ming, 6th Field Artillery Brigade, as executive for the summer training camps, and Major H. A. Austin, Infantry, as adjutant. A number of officers of the regular army have been ordered to Fort Sheridan for assignment to the camp staff and as instructors during the summer.

On June 17th a group of 183 recent graduates of college ROTC units from the middle west sported their 2nd lieutenant's bars for the first time during two weeks intensive instruction under the supervision of Colonel J. S. Dusenburg, Coast Artillery Corps. At the same time a group of 258 embryo Coast Artillery men from the Reserve Officers Training Corps of the Universities of Illinois, Minnesota, Michigan State, Kansas, Kansas State college, and Washington university gathered together for six weeks training under the supervision of Lieutenant Colonel B. S. Du Bois, Coast Artillery Corps. These students have been organized into into three provisional batteries, which rotate in handling the army's three inch antiaircraft guns, 50 caliber machine guns, and antiaircraft searchlights. Target practices with service ammunition will be fired at sleeve targets towed by high speed planes of the army air service during the month of July.

On July 3rd a group of 145 Reserve Officers from the 61st, 526th, 531st 532nd, 945th and 951st Coast Artillery Regiments reported for two weeks training. These officers from the middle west are all assigned to antiaircraft units. Recent developments abroad have indicated that antiaircraft artillery will play an increasingly important role in any future emergency, and reserve officers assigned to antiaircraft regiments are making every effort to perfect themselves in the technique of firing the "sky guns."

During the period July 7th to August 5th approximately 1250 boys from Illinois and Wisconsin will assemble at Fort Sheridan for the 1938 Citizens Military Training camp. Young men who attend four summer camps and complete the course of instruction successfully are commissioned 2nd lieutenants in the Officers' Reserve Corps. In general the forenoons are devoted to military training, and the afternoons to athletics, recreation, and such additional military work as may be necessary for candidates of the higher courses.

The candidates will be divided into six rifle companies of approximately 200 each, and one machine gun company with a strength of 100. Upon their arrival in camp each candidate is given a strict physical examination by United States Army surgeons to determine their fitness. Any boy who shows the slightest sign of any contagious sickness is segregated without delay. Candidates whose physical condition does not meet the exacting standards required are rejected, and returned to their homes. Instruction during the 1938 camp will be conducted under the supervision of Colonel C. A. Lewis, Infantry, assisted by Major G. S. Clarke, Infantry, as adjotant, and Captain A. F. White, Infantry, handling the plans and training.

The direct instruction of CMTC candidates will be the responsibility of Reserve Officers assigned to four infantry regiments which will be ordered to Fort Sheridan for that purpose. Upon their arrival each candidate takes a shower, is physically examined, fitted with clothing, and assigned to his company where he is issued such additional equipment as he will need during the camp. His civilian clothing is stored, and, within 24 hours of his arrival in camp, a letter is sent to his parents notifying them of his
