N. Y. A. Funds 16%

State Director William J. Campbell of the National Youth Administration today announced receipt of an allocation from the President of student aid funds totaling \$1,-1938-39 academic year in Illinois, an increase of 16 per cent over that for the last school year.

NYA aid for needy high school pupils in Illinois totals \$556,085, or approximately \$62,787 per month for nine months, Mr. Campbell said. College aid, including undergraduate and graduate students, amounts to \$671,867 in all, or \$74,651 per month.

"Student aid funds are paid to needy youths between the ages of 16 and 24 years, inclusive. For

part-time work after class hours," Mr. Campbell explained. A maximum sum of \$6 per month is paid to high school students, to be used for essentials such as books, carfare and lunches undergraduate colege students receive an average of \$15 per month for part-time work, and graduate students get an

average of \$30 per month. "High school pupils to receive the aid are selected by the principals of high schools and student aid work in colleges is obtained from college authorities. - School heads designate the types of socially desirable work to be done. High school pupils may work a maximum of twenty hours a week and college students a maximum of thirty hours weekly. The hourly wage paid is based on the prevailing rate in the institution or

In the 1937-38 school year, it was pointed out, 13,451 high school pupils per month and 5,699 undergraduate and graduate college students were aided by the National Youth Administration for Illinois. Approximately 16 per cent more students will be aided in the coming academic year as a result of the increase in funds.
