

Car Careens In Collision Sunday On Central Avenue

A near fatality occurred Sunday afternoon at the intersection of First street and Central avenue, when a car driven south on First street by Mrs. C. W. Thomas, 537 Linden avenue, rammed into the side of a car driven east on Central avenue by Earl Gosswiller, 1816 Chase street, Chicago. The Gosswiller car was turned over by the impact. Had the car made one more revolution, it is likely that Gosswiller's wife, who was riding with him, and who was badly cut and bruised, would have been crushed.

Mrs. Thomas escaped injury, while the driver of the other car received minor bruises. Mrs. Gosswiller was taken to the Highland Park hospital where she was attended by Dr. Lobby.

Mrs. Mary B. Swift, widow of State Representative Rodney R. Swift, and her daughter, Miss Genevieve, 23 years old, were injured Saturday evening when their car ran into a light pole at Green Bay road and Homewood avenue. Miss Swift, who was driving, suffered a dislocated jaw and bruised her mother was slightly cut and bruised. They were attended by Dr. Roberts at the Highland Park hospital. Mrs. Swift and her daughter reside at 2155 Pine Point drive.

Coast Guard Radio Station Site Is Bought In Northbrook

Twenty-seven acres of land in Northbrook was acquired by the federal government early this week as a site for the new \$120,000 radio station to serve the Chicago division of the coast guard.

Assistant United States District Attorney David H. Neuman negotiated the deal with the Lake Shore Trust & Savings Bank, trustee for the property. The purchase price was \$6,750.

"Bids for construction of the station have been called for," Neuman said, "and the work is expected to be under way soon."

The new station will replace the equipment coast guards have been using the last four years at Wilmette Harbor.

It is intended that two wavelengths shall be used, one for communicating with commercial lake vessels, the other for communication between coast guard stations and boats.

Estimate D.F. Kelly Estate Over Million

The will of the late D. F. Kelly, retired president of the Fair store in Chicago, and a former resident of this city which is estimated at more than \$1,000,000 will be filed in Waukegan today, according to an announcement made by Attorney James G. Condon for the estate.

Mr. Kelly who has been a resident of Lake Forest died in Bergen, Norway, July 23 after a brief illness of pneumonia.

Funeral services were held Saturday at the Holy Name Cathedral. Cardinal Mundelein presided from the throne and Bernard J. Sheil intoned the pontifical solemn high requiem mass. His body was interred in Calvary cemetery.

The deceased is survived by his wife, Mrs. Irene Sullivan Kelly and a daughter Mrs. Charles P. Vogel (Kathleen).
