

Andrew Peterson Victim of Stroke Funeral, Tuesday

Andrew Peterson, aged 64, 635 Vine avenue, suffered a stroke, Saturday evening, while returning to his home from a drive to Deerfield, with his wife, and died a short time later at his home.

The Petersons had gone to visit friends and were en route to their home about 10 o'clock. Mr. Peterson complained of the lights being dim and a few seconds later had driven his car off the pavement into a ditch on Deerfield road, near the Gastfield home. When he did not respond to his wife's questions, she went to the nearby home for help.

He was taken to his home where a physician was summoned, but he passed away a short time later.

Mr. Peterson was born Dec. 15, 1874 in Schleswig, Holstein, Germany and came to this country with his parents when six years of age. His parents, the Jens Petersons settled in Deerfield. For the past forty-five years, Mr. Peterson had been a resident of Highland Park. He had been in the employ of the Public Service company for thirty years, being retired about five years ago.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning at 10:30 o'clock at the First United Evangelical church. Burial was in Northshore Garden of Memories.

Besides his wife Mary, the deceased is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Cecelia Cooksey of Northbrook and Mrs. Lillian Heinzen of Kenosha, Wis., six grandchildren, one sister Mrs. Lena Lenke of Waukegan and a half brother Mr. Peter Peterson of Deerfield.

Mr. Peterson was a member of the Modern Woodman of America and was an active member of the First United Evangelical church.

Mrs. O'Keefe Retires As Acting Manager of R.R. Men's Home

It is with deep regret that we learn that Mrs. Minnie O'Keefe, widow of the late John O'Keefe, secretary-treasurer and manager of the Home for Aged and Disabled Railroad Employees of America, will retire as acting manager of the Home on September 1st of this year.

Mr. and Mrs. O'Keefe have been in charge of the Home for the past thirty-five years, and have made many friends on the North Shore during that time. They came to Highland Park from Chicago in November, 1903, when the Railroad Men's Home consisted of three old frame houses in which eighteen aged and disabled veterans of the rail were domiciled. Many of the older residents of our city undoubtedly remember the original Home. Six years later, in April, 1909, the

new fireproof structure at St. John's avenue and Beach street was dedicated, and stands as a memorial to the untiring efforts of Mr. O'Keefe, his faithful wife, and the railroad brotherhood men who contributed so generously to the building of the Home.

Mrs. O'Keefe has given the best years of her life, working with her husband for the welfare and comfort of the aged and disabled railroad men who have sought the shelter and protection of their Home, and now that she has decided to take a well earned rest, we join the residents and staff of the institution in wishing her many years of contentment and happiness.
