According to the school authorities, school attendance this year will be as large or larger than last year. John W. Thalman, superintendent of the Waukegan Township school said today, "We are expecting the largest enrollment our school has ever had. More than 700 new pupils already have registered. Last year our opening enrollment was 2200."

John S. Clark, superintendent of the City Public schools, said he expected an attendance of about 4,000 in the ten local grade schools.

Father Francis J. Shea, pastor of the Immaculate Conception church said the four Parish schools of Waukegan would have about the same attendance as last year. In his Parish, the oldest in Lake county, established in 1859, there will be about 300 pupils in attendance.
