

**Present Portrait in Opening Event of N. S. Alpha Phi's**

In announcing their social program for the year 1938-39, the North Shore Alumnae of Alpha Phi are privileged to have for their opening event of the fall an important part in the dedication of the new Willard Hall on the Northwestern university campus.

Last June nationwide press notices announced the interesting action taken by the Alpha Phi International Fraternity assembled in convention at Pasadena, California, in the commissioning of a famous portrait artist to paint a memorial portrait of Miss Frances E. Willard, for presentation to the new Freshman Women's dormitory to be dedicated in September and replacing the original dormitory bearing Miss Willard's name.

Miss Frances E. Willard, famed throughout the world for her devotion to the cause of W.C.T.U., was an honored and revered member of Alpha Phi, that being her sorority affiliation when a college girl at Syracuse university. Later Miss Willard was instrumental in the founding of Beta Chapter of Alpha Phi on the Northwestern campus—the first woman's fraternity to have a chapter there. She was associated with the faculty of the university and at one time served as national president of Alpha Phi.

The ceremony of presentation of the portrait of Miss Willard will take place at 4:15 Wednesday afternoon, September 28th, on the West Quadrangle. It will be conducted by Mrs. Ira E. Westbrook of Evanston, formerly prominent in the faculty of the Northwestern School of Speech. Mrs. Westbrook will represent the North Shore Alumnae of Alpha Phi. Several grand officers of the executive board of Alpha Phi plan to arrive in Evanston for the ceremony, which follows the formal dedication of Willard Hall at 4:00 by President Walter Dill Scott, and the pageant at 2:30 sponsored by the Associate Alumnae of the university.

At 5 o'clock Alpha Phi alumnae and collegiate members are holding a reception at the sorority house for Miss Dorothy Kernohan of Toronto, Canada, the International President of Alpha Phi, and other board members here for the ceremony. A buffet supper at 6 o'clock will conclude the day's program.
