

### Ex-Sheriff Ahlstrom Passes on Thursday

Edwin A. Ahlstrom, 45 years old, chief of the Johns-Manville police force, passed away at the U. S. Veterans' hospital at Hines, early last (Thursday) morning.

The deceased had held the position of chief of police of the city of Waukegan, and served Lake county as sheriff from 1922 to 1926. He was born in Waukegan, May 10, 1893, and had always made his home in that city. During his earlier years he was engaged in the electrical business, but gave that up when he entered the political field. He was appointed as chief of the Waukegan police force in 1930, and since 1934 had been with the Johns-Manville company.

Mr. Ahlstrom had not been feeling well, and on Tuesday entered the Hines institution for observation. He had suffered a severe attack of asthma Monday night, but his condition was not considered serious, and members of the family were planning to go to visit him when the news of his death reached them.

He is survived by his wife, the former Hazel Cole, and three daughters, Mrs. Phyllis Lundquist of Los Angeles, Barbara Anna and Marilyn Grace of Waukegan, two sisters, Mrs. Dora Lutter, Mrs. Edith Lundquist, and two brothers, Carl and Harry, all of Waukegan.

Funeral services were held Saturday.

### Large Attendance Marks Opening of Agricultural Show

Vincent Casey, chairman of the farm features of the Fair, indicated that one of the big jobs would be the judging of the contestants.

He has obtained the best possible men for this job, he says. E. T. Robbins of the University of Illinois College of Agriculture will judge the horses; J. H. Broch of Woodstock will judge dairy cattle; Paul Furr of De Kalb, vocational agricultural teacher, will be the judge of the fat stock; R. Rowley, vocational agricultural teacher from Chicago Heights, will name the poultry winners; Russell Rosnasser of the De Kalb Cultural Association is the grain judge; Dr. J. B. Corns of the University of Illinois will pick the winner of the horticulture displays and S. C. Pallock, Antioch florist, will judge the floriculture classes.

Outstanding in the week's program will be the horse show on Thursday and Friday evenings. A special show and a polo game, played by junior boys and girls will be held on Friday, Children's day.
