Mrs. A. S. McCracken Passes Away Tuesday

Funeral services for Mrs. Elizabeth McCracken, who died Tuesday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Hugh Wilson, of 250 Park avenue, were held yesterday (Wednesday) at 2 o'clock. Mrs. McCracken, who was 78 years old, was the widow of Charles A. S. McCracken, for forty years managing editor of the Drovers Journal. He also served as live stock editor of the Tribune, the

old Record-Herald, and Chicago Inter-Ocean. He died in 1927.

Mrs. McCracken was born in Chicago, the daughter of John and Ellen Hughes, pioneer settlers. The Hughes home on the north side escaped the flames in the Chicago fire and was turned into an emergency hospital and shelter for several families. Mrs. McCracken is survived by Mrs. Wilson, Mrs. Harwood Byrnes, daughters, and three sons, Howard, Warren, and Gordon. The funeral was at the home of Mrs. Wilson. Burial was in Mount Hope cemetery.

Charles J. Meyer Former Resident Passes Away Monday

Charles J. Meyer, 76, an insurance broker of Lombard, and a resident of Highland Park for many years, died early Monday morning at St. Therese hospital, Waukegan, from a gunshot wound in the right temple.

He left his home early Saturday evening, and went to North Shore

cemetery, where he and his wife owned a four grave plot. His body was found sprawled on the ground by an attendant about noon Sunday. A .38 caliber revolver was found lying on the ground near the body, with one cartridge discharged.

Mr. Meyers was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, Dec. 25, 1861. After completing his education in Cincinnati, he secured a position as statistician with the Santa Fe railroad and for a number of years resided in California. Later he came to Chicago where he continued his work as statistician and a public accountant, until a few years ago when he entered the insurance field.

On Nov. 21, 1919, he married Miss Lillian Chase of that city, and in 1921 Mr. and Mrs. Meyer came to Highland Park where they resided for 16 years.

He was a great lover of his home and spent a great amount of time there. He was a lover of good music and enjoyed listening to worthwhile concerts. He was known by his intimate friends to be cordial, congenial and of a very jovial and

happy disposition even at times when the way of life seemed hard. He was a member of A. O. Fay lodge.

Mr. Meyer leaves only his wife to survive him.

Funeral services are being held this afternoon (Thursday) at two o'clock from Kelley's chapel. Rev. H. F. Siemsen of Bethany church officiating. Interment will be in Northshore Garden of Memories.

PRESERVE OUR STATE BANKING SYSTEM
by Ratifying
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
VOTE YES NOV. 8

The State Constitution is the Peoples' Law. They establish it by direct vote and only they can change it. When a provision ceases to serve the public interests it should be changed.

Illinois banking laws are out of date. The National Banking Act and the Banking Acts of our neighbor States have been revised to meet new conditions. Our banking laws must be brought up to date.

The proposed Constitutional Amendment will remove the double liability of stockholders of our State Banks. It has been removed from National Bank stock and from State Bank stock in 39 states.

The proposed Constitutional Amendment will remove the requirement of referendum on banking legislation and enable our General Assembly to modernize our State Banking Act promptly.
