Woman Injured in Auto Collision Oct. 23, Passes on

Mrs. Gerda Anderson, 56, employed at 519 Eastwood avenue, died Thursday in the Cook County hospital in Chicago as the result of injuries received in an automobile accident on Skokie Blvd. at Berkeley road on October 23. No report of the collision was made to the Highland Park police due to the fact that no one seemed to have been seriously hurt. Two days later, however, Mrs. Anderson complained of internal pains and was removed to the hospital.

When the accident occurred, Mrs. Anderson was riding with her son Edward, 21. They were driving north on Skokie and collided with a car as the son Edward attempted

to turn left onto Berkeley road. Robert Blust of 1523 Fowler street, Evanston, was the driver of the second car. He was headed west on Berkeley road.

Mrs. Anderson's death was the second attributed to vehicles in Highland Park this year.

An inquest held Saturday in Chicago was continued to Nov. 15.

Glencoe Man Dies At Local Hospital

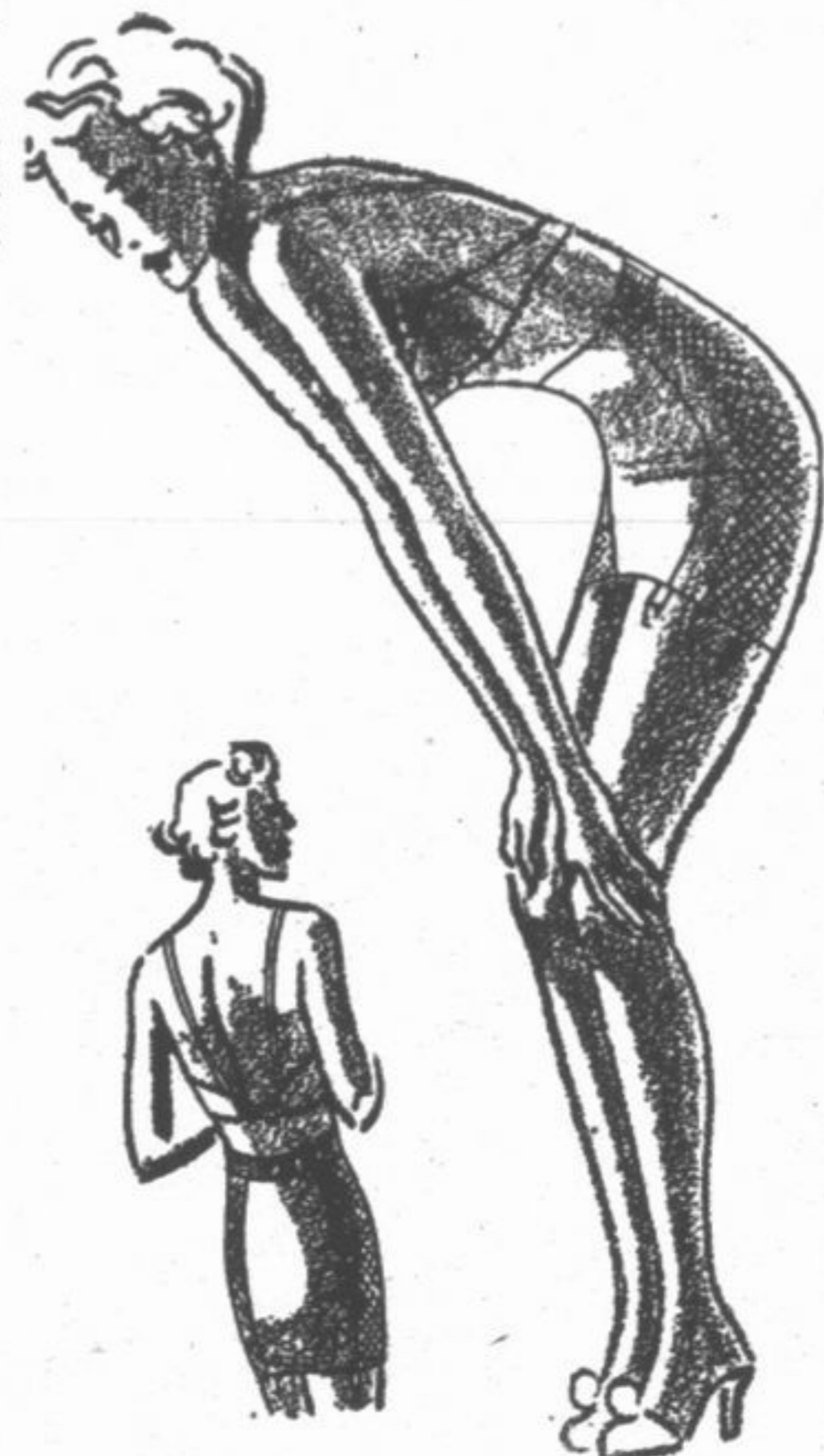
