The boys of the cast enacted their roles with precision, and dramatic feeling but their personal appearances were more youthful than the girls. Carroll Binder as Carter Hibbard; Elwin Kruse as Stephen Wayne; Hudson Holtje as Tom Harwick and Dick Zurwelle as Senator Kearns were outstanding characters.

No finer production, with the exception perhaps of "Pride and Prejudice" given last spring, has been presented by this high school aggregation.
