Over one hundred letters have been mailed to the pastors in Lake county asking that the work of the Lake County Tuberculosis Association be mentioned in their sermons or in their church bulletins on Sunday, November 27.

The Christmas Seal Trailer will be shown through the courtesy of motion picture managers in the county. Radio will also play an important part in bringing you several educational programs.

"We look upon the Christmas Seal Sale as our opportunity to focus public attention on the dangers of tuberculosis and the hope of conquering it," said Mr. Edward L. Baker, Seal Sale chairman. "For this reason, we utilize every available medium. Without the cooperation so generously given by the newspapers and other agencies, our educational programs would not be possible."
