

### Highland Park Hospital Board Engages Experts

At its regular monthly meeting held last Tuesday, the board of managers of the Highland Park Hospital Foundation elected to retain Schmidt, Garden and Erikson, hospital architects and consultants, to make recommendations in the board's future plans for increased hospital facilities. While there are to be no immediate additions to the Highland Park hospital, the rapid growth of the community and the steadily increasing use of the hospital make it imperative that the board give serious thought to a future need for increased facilities. When improvements and additions are considered, it is well to make them according to the preconceived plans of experts rather than according to the ideas of a lay board. Thus, in authorizing the retention of Schmidt, Garden and Erikson, the Highland Park hospital will have the benefit of an organization which has built or supervised the building of more than 30 hospitals in the Chicago area. "These widely known specialists," said R. P. Sherer, president of the Hospital board, "will assist us chiefly through expert advice and recommendations. Their long and rich experience in hospital building will prevent us from making additions and improvements to our hospital which in a few years' time at great expense might have to be undone! We have retained them to guide us in a long-term program of future development that will enable the Highland Park hospital to continue to minister capably and responsibly to more and more men, women, and children of the North Shore and in those communities located to the west of us which are without hospital facilities."

#### THIS WEEK IN WASHINGTON

Evanston, Ill., Nov. 19—Now that the "tumult and shouting has died" and the American people have spoken at the ballot boxes, it remains for us to appraise the results and to translate the expressed general will of the people into a definite course of action. That is the task of both parties. Failure to interpret election results intelligently is more or less certain to bring dire consequences to the Administration or the Republican Party, as the case may be, when they come before the people again, two years hence. This was the mistake the New Dealers made as a result of the election two years ago, for which they suffered in the voting November 8. In 1936 the New Deal won a landslide victory. They carried every State in the Union except Maine and Vermont. That result was interpreted as a "mandate from the people," with the word "mandate" construed as broadly as possible. They were too elated with their success to remember that 17 million people expressed themselves in opposition. They didn't realize there was or could be any opposition to the New Deal that should be considered. They interpreted the 1936 election results to mean the New Deal had a "mandate" to do everything and anything they saw fit. In that interpretation the New Dealers were in error as has now been made clear by the people themselves. Republican success in this last election exceeded the expectations of all the party leaders. Gains were anticipated but no one for a moment imagined that they would be so pronounced and so national in scope. Naturally, those of us who are affiliated with the Republican Party are rejoicing in the election results. After several lean years we can hardly be denied this opportunity to rejoice. But, it seems to me, the Republicans will make a serious mistake if, in their enthusiasm of success, they interpret the results as a complete and unequivocal repudiation of everything the New Deal has represented and has done. Such a conclusion would be fatal to the Party when it presents its Presidential candidate to the people in 1940.

### Evanston P. O. Is Announcing Unique Educational Exhibit

A unique educational exhibit will be available to North Shore residents through the courtesy of Postmaster George N. Taylor in Evanston's beautiful new post office. The exhibit, an exact reproduction of the pilot's control cabin of the Miami Flyer, a modern 21 passenger Douglas airliner was placed in the lobby of the post office today by Eastern Air Lines. It will remain on exhibition until Saturday, November 26. In attendance at the display from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily, is Flight - Steward David Schriener who holds a transport pilot's license and is qualified to explain the function of more than a 100 instruments and controls which are used in modern flight and navigation. The purpose of the display, Postmaster Taylor said, is to show airmail users the modern scientific aids which make it possible to speed airmail and passengers from Chicago to Miami or the West Coast overnight, or to New York in four hours. A part of the display is a large airmail map with buttons at the principal airmail stops. Pushing a button at any city flashes a red light which indicates the mail closing time for that city.
