

Second Term Of Adult Classes To Begin January 9th

Registration for the Adult Education classes during the second term starting January 9 has begun at the Highland Park High school. Opportunity for new enrollments will be given on Monday and Wednesday evenings, December 12 and 14. Registrations will also be taken on January 4, 5 and 9. The total enrollment in classes

for the first term was 722. This surpasses the total of any previous term since the project started. Attendance likewise was better than ever before. An average of 80 per cent of those registered were in attendance each Monday or Wednesday evening.

Several new classes will be started on January 9 if sufficient interest is indicated by the advance registration.

Much interest in the new Archery class has already been shown. Mr. Cunningham will direct both the

shooting and the making of bows and arrows.

Classes in candid photography and pottery will also be given if the community wants them.

Increased interest this year has been evidenced in Mr. Field's leatherwork project, Mrs. Degenhardt's drawing and painting class, M. Davitt's bookkeeping class and Mr. Scheuchensflug's badminton groups.

More registrations are necessary in Miss Daley's tap dancing class if this activity is continued. The present members are having lots of fun

and urge all those who have not registered and are interested in tap dancing to sign up so that this class may continue. Classes in both beginning and advanced tap dancing will be offered.

More registrations are also necessary in the beginning shorthand class conducted by Mr. Heins. Anyone having at least one term of shorthand may enroll in this class.

A complete schedule of the second term classes will be published in the Highland Park papers on

January 5, 1939. Inspection of classes now running will be welcomed by the Adult Education Council. Come to the high school and get acquainted with our program next Monday or Wednesday evening.

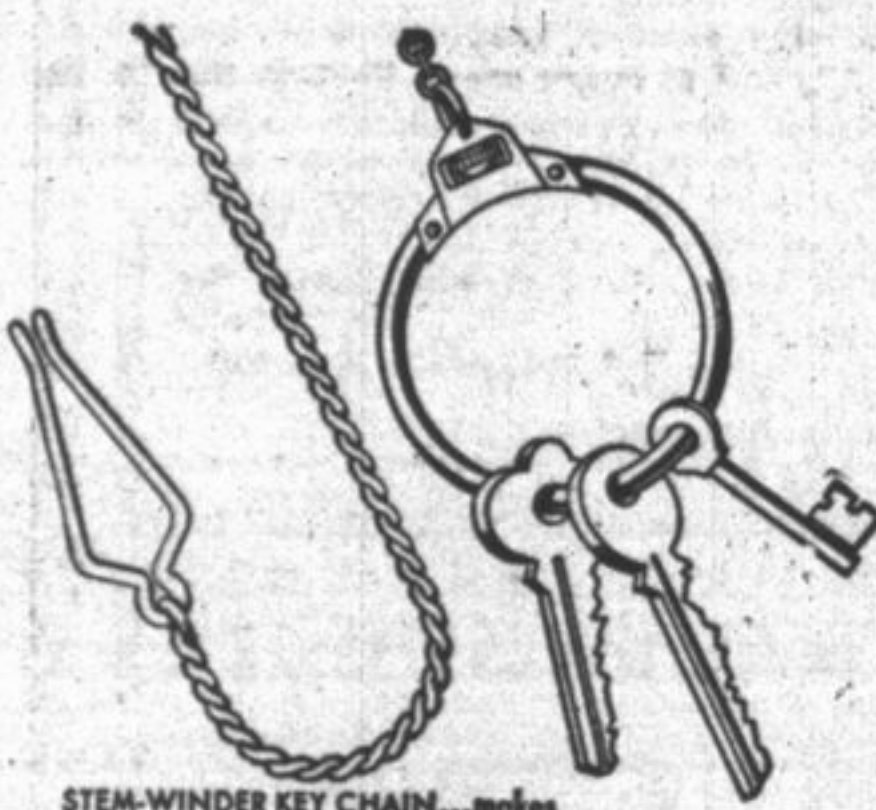

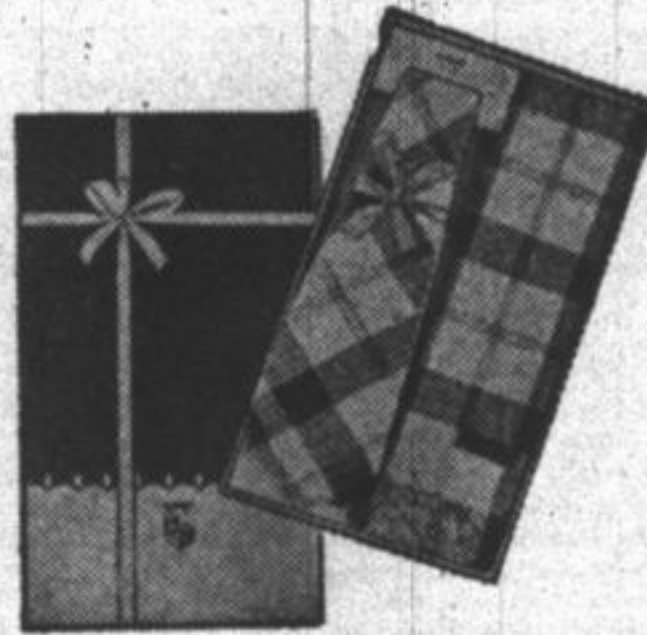

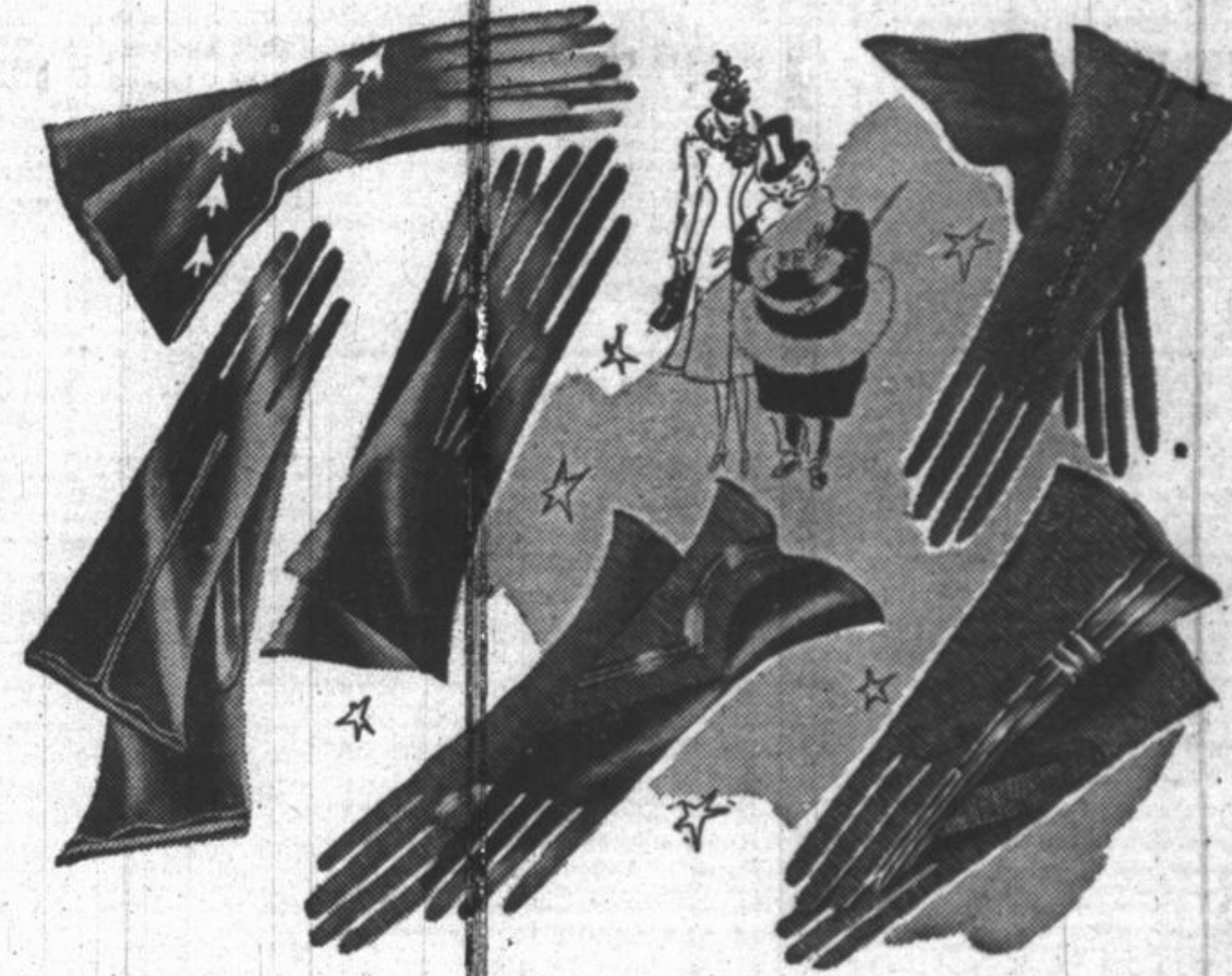
