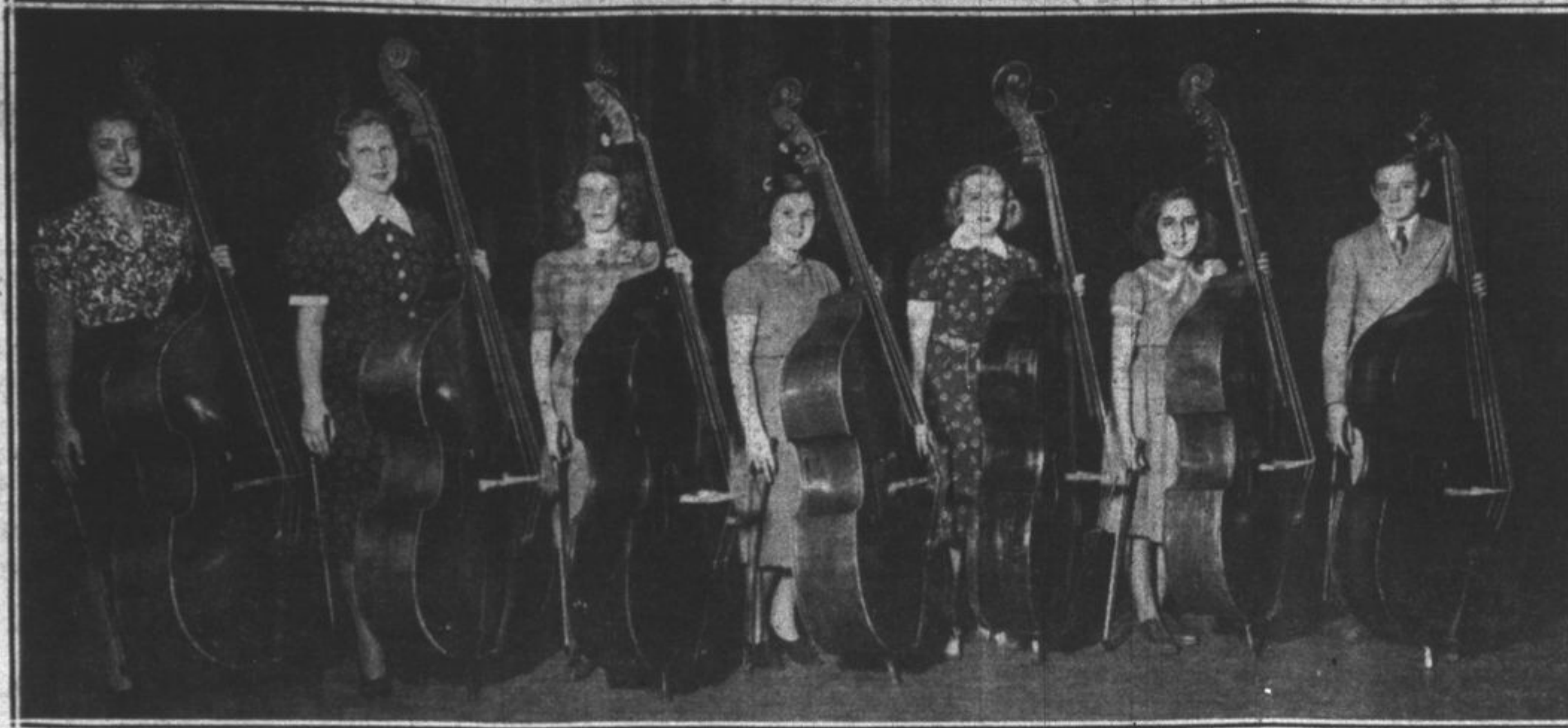


Bass Section of the Highland Park Symphony Orchestra
