

Local Residents Committee Seek To Aid N. S. Line

of Highland Park also adopted a resolution, as follows:
Resolution Adopted by the Common Council of the City of Highland Park:

At a regular meeting of the City Council of Highland Park, presided over by the Honorable Wm. J. Doolley, mayor, it was deemed desirable to put the city on record as regards the situation of the C. N. S. & Mil. R.R. The following motion and resolution was presented and unanimously passed:

"Whereas the City of Highland Park has large civic business and political interests at stake in the continued operation of the C. N. S. & Mil. R.R., and whereas many of its citizens are employed therein, and transportation of its citizens and school children by the railroad is of importance and necessity, therefore,

"Be It Resolved, that the City of Highland Park cannot permit the discontinuance of service of the C. N. S. & Mil. R.R., and requests immediate action of the Federal authorities to the end that a loan of about three million dollars be made to rehabilitate the electric railroad and interurban service, so that no suspension of same occurs."

It was further directed that the City Clerk, V. C. Musser, send copies of the above resolution to Harold L. Ickes, Washington, D. C., Frank Just of the Waukegan News-Sun, Receiver A. A. Sprague of C. N. S. & Mil. R.R. and the local committee working on said matter.

At a meeting of the Highland Park Chamber of Commerce, held

Tuesday evening, attention was called to the existent conditions of the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee railroad, and the following resolution was presented and adopted:

Resolution
Whereas: It is definitely known that over one hundred families in this community are entirely dependent for employment and support upon the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad, and

Whereas: A possible closing down of the railroad would adversely affect and injure many local firms, as was evidenced during the recent inactivity, and

Whereas: The property values in this community would depreciate and the growth of the community curtailed, therefore,

"Be It Resolved: That the Highland Park Chamber of Commerce take all steps within its power to cooperate with the local committee in securing the continued operation of the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad, and

"Be It Further Resolved: That the Highland Park Chamber of Commerce favor an immediate grant by the Federal Government, or its agencies, of the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to aid in the rehabilitation of the said Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad.
