

High School Quintet Loses Close Battle To State Champions

Highland Park's two high school basketball teams found that games on successive nights with Waukegan, second place holders in the Suburban league, and Dundee, defending state champions, were slightly more than they could handle.

The Dundee varsity had romped through a 75-13 massacre Friday night, whereas the local five had dealt Waukegan a hard-fought 29-23 lacing. In Saturday's game, Highland Park forged ahead of Dundee in the opening quarter 13-11, but lost the game 51-43 as Bernardi and Nizzi left the contest on fouls early in the first half. Midio Zanotti tossed seven baskets for high-point honors.

The Highland Park fresh-soph team outscored their opponents in all but the first quarter, but lost 35-25.

Dundee will play a return match with Highland Park on the local floor Saturday, Jan. 21.
