"Colorful Old World Europe", an illustrated travel lecture, will be presented by Harvey S. Novel Skating Rink Entertainment Plan Of Braeside P. T. A.

A novel type of community skating rink entertainment is promised by "A Night in St. Moritz," to be offered by the Braeside Skating Rink on Monday night, January 23.

Novel Skating Rink Entertainment Plan Of Braeside P. T. A.

Warm Response To Refugee Appeal Made

Telephones have been buzzing and door bells ringing in the drive for the Jewish Welfare Fund, now being carried on by the Women's Division on the North Shore.

"Never," reports Mrs. Alfred Alschuler, chairman of the drive, "has the community been so stirred. Ordinarily it is not easy to get people to solicit funds, but this time every woman has been anxious to do and give whatever she could. Many have volunteered their services. People of widely differing religious views have sent in voluntary subscriptions. This has cheered us greatly. It is good to know that Christians as well as Jews understand that this is not a fight of Christian against Jew, but it is a fight in which a dictatorship mad for power is ruthlessly pursuing its way. Against this dictatorship, democracy can and will maintain itself. In this fight, Christian and Jew have an equal stake."
