Great interest has been shown by the members of the Highland Park Woman's club in the talks which have been given to the "Collectors' Study Group" and the many non-members who have attended the previous instructive and stimulating meetings.

Tuesday morning, the 31st of January, at 10 o'clock the third talk and exhibit will take place at the club house. Sundell, through her interest in music, being a graduate of the Chicago Musical College, and her good fortune in having travelled widely, became interested in collecting bells from all parts of the world. 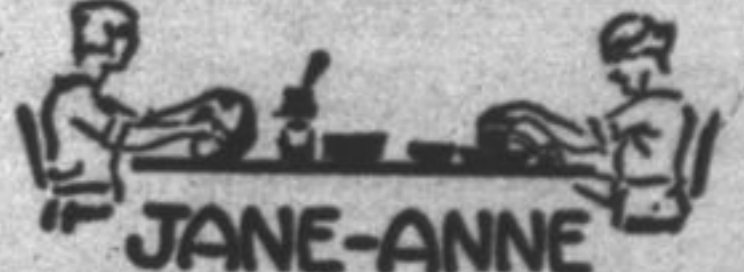
