Do not use Flag in any form of advertising.

When Flag is displayed on a platform, place staff to right of speaker-When Flag is displayed on floor level, place staff to right of audience. When Flag is used on a motor car display Flag from staff, never drape or tie on-

Salute Flag when it passes. Honor and Protect Flag under all circumstances.


