

Densel Buildings Destroyed By Fire Early Saturday A. M.

Three departments responded to a spectacular fire, which destroyed two 2-story frame buildings on the Densel property at Blodgett early Saturday morning. The damage, which is covered by insurance, was estimated at between \$2,000 and \$5,000, according to report.

The fire which was apparently caused by spontaneous combustion in a junk shed which was leased by Ben Farber at 1205 Deerfield road, was discovered by Vince Peddie, 19, of 619 Homewood avenue, and a girl companion, Nancy Rosenthal, 15, of 294 Marshall avenue, who were returning home on Deerfield road.

Vincent awakened Marco Ugolini, who was asleep in the second story of the building, and helped him get his automobile out of the building. The young lady went to Parkside tea room, just off Deerfield road, and turned in the alarm for the fire department.

In order to protect adjoining property, a call was made to Highwood and Lake Forest departments for help. Had the wind changed it would have endangered huge oil tanks in the vicinity.

Scores of motorists traveling on Deerfield road and nearby Skokie road were attracted to the scene of the flames.
