Funeral services were held in the Fort Sheridan chapel Monday afternoon and interment was made in Fort Sheridan cemetery.

Besides his wife, the deceased is survived by a son, Leslie W. Smith of Highwood, and three daughters, Mrs. Hazel Warren, Mrs. Gertrude Goseman and Mrs. Allene Cummings.
