Elmer R. Evans Dies; Funeral, Saturday

Elmer Robert Evans, 55 years old, died Thursday night at the Highland Park hospital, following a brief illness of a few months. His death comes as a shock to his many friends here.

Mr. Evans who spent his entire life in this city, was born Feb. 14, 1884, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert G. Evans, one of the pioneer families of this city. The father, Mr. R. G. Evans, served as Mayor of Highland Park for five consecutive terms.

In 1908 Mr. Evans was married to Miss Elizabeth Kassmussen. Three children were born to this union, Robert, Harold and Norman. Mrs. Evans died in 1936. On Sept. 25th, 1937, Mr. Evans was married to Mrs. Bernice Petz.

The deceased was a very quiet and unpretentious man. He had little to say when in a group, but he was a man who craved friendship and fellowship with those whom he knew best. He was very much a home man and spent a great deal of his time with his family, to whom he was very devoted and affectionate. His unassuming manner won for him a great host of friends.

Besides his wife, Mr. Evans leaves his three sons, Robert of Highland Park, Harold and Norman of Chicago and Robert Petz his foster

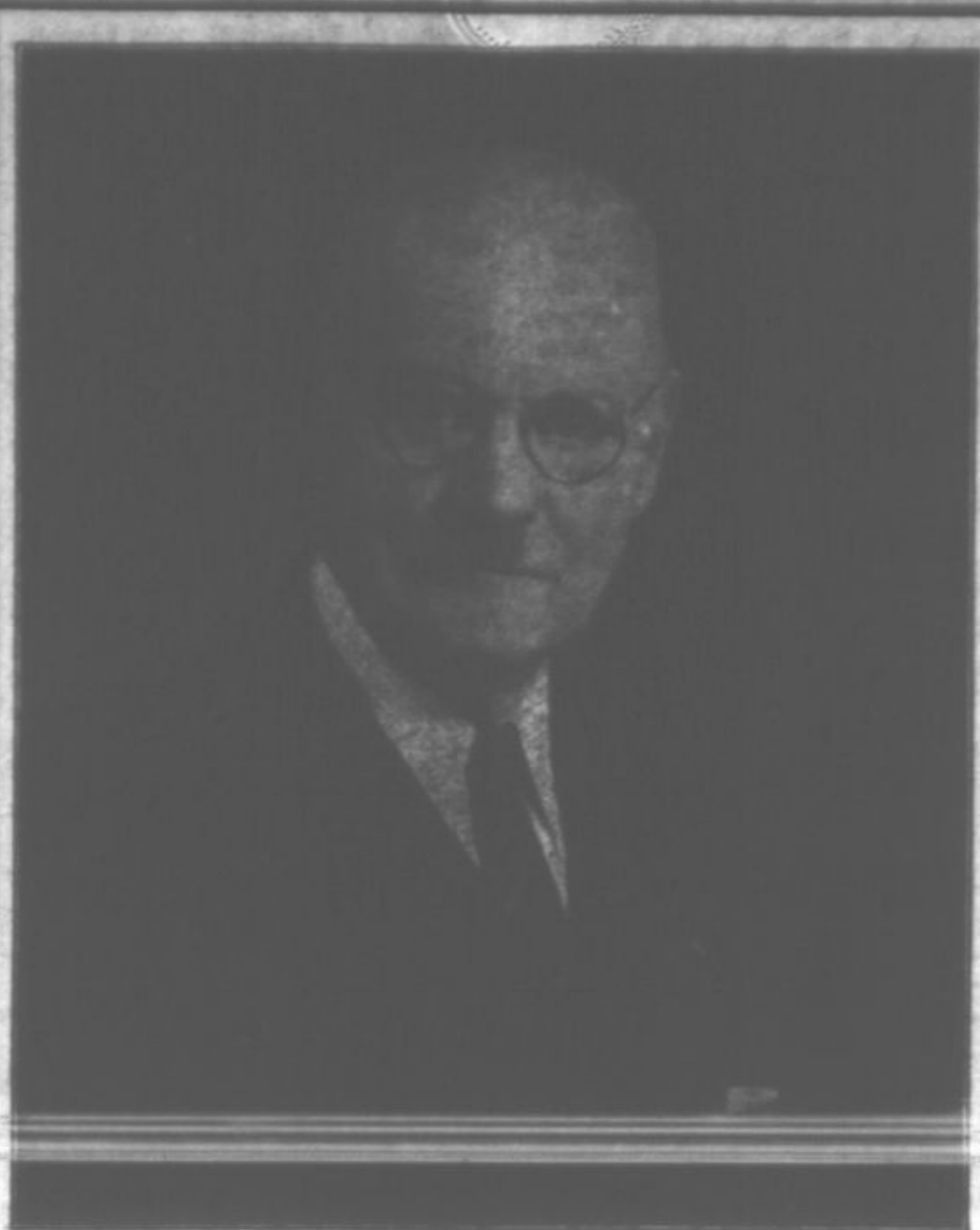

A memorial service was conducted by Rev. H. F. Siemsen at the Kelley Chapel, Saturday afternoon at 2:30. Burial took place in Lake Forest cemetery.
