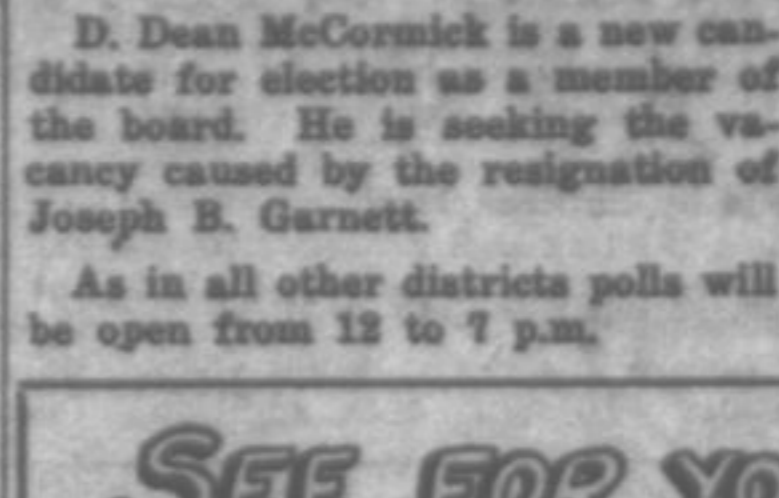
D. Dean McCormick is a new candidate for election as a member of the board. He is seeking the vacancy caused by the resignation of Joseph B. Garnett.

As in all other districts polls will be open from 12 to 7 p.m.

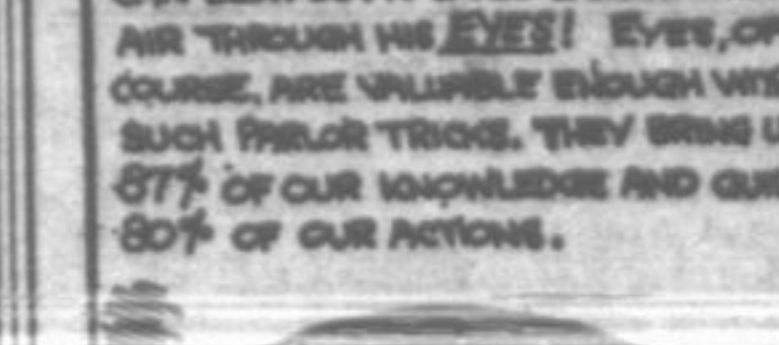
The H. W. Holding home, 1241 S. St. Johns Avenue, was damaged by fire last Friday afternoon, estimated at about \$600.
