

**Bethany Celebrates Tenth Anniversary; Bishop Epp Speaks**

Ten years ago on April 14th the Bethany Evangelical Church, located on the corner of Laurel Avenue and McGovern street was dedicated as a place of worship in this community. On the coming Sunday the congregation and its friends plan to celebrate the 10th Anniversary. The pastor and officials of the church have invited Bishop George Edward Epp, Bishop of the Central Area of the Evangelical Church, to be the guest speaker at the services of the day. Bishop Epp will speak at 11:00 a. m., and at 4:00 p. m. He is a very able speaker and will challenge the audiences that hear him. District Supt. Rev. L. C. Schmidt, D. S. of the Evangelical Church of the Chicago area will also be present to participate in the services. Pastors of the Highland Park Churches also of nearby churches and their congregations have also been invited to share this glad day with Bethany, they are also particularly invited to join in on this 4:00 p. m. service. Following the Bishop's message in the 4:00 o'clock service, the Dedication of 10 years ago will be reaffirmed. The ladies of the Church will serve light refreshments in the social rooms of the Church following the afternoon service, all members and friends who are present in the afternoon are invited to share in the fellowship of that social period.

During the past 10 years Bethany has enjoyed a normal and healthy growth. The attendance at its morning worship services have approximately doubled during this period. Most of the organizations of the Church likewise have experienced splendid development. Many new activities have been added to take care of the interests of the young people and young married couples.

Ten years ago the congregation was burdened with a tremendous debt on its new building and faced a real crisis during the early days of the depression. Generous gifts from friends and sacrificial giving on the part of those interested in the Church, made it possible for Bethany to liquidate its entire debt in a period when it seemed least possible to do it. It is only fitting that after these strenuous years of work and giving that the congregation should celebrate and give gratitude for what has been accomplished.

**J. Emerson Morgan Passes Away April 10; Buried in Ottawa**

Funeral services and burial for J. Emerson Morgan were held this week in Ottawa, Ill. Mr. Morgan, who was in his 80th year, passed away on Monday, April 10, at the Lake County General Hospital in Wankegan following a long illness. For the past four years Mr. Morgan has lived at the A. H. Shugrue home. His wife, Mrs. Beatrice Morgan, lives in Kaytesville, Missouri, and his daughter, Madeline Morgan and her brother, Emerson B. Morgan, live in Los Angeles with their

mother, the first Mrs. Morgan. The Morgans came to Deerfield in 1893 and purchased the E. H. Osterman house on Osterman avenue. Mr. Morgan's profession was actuarial work in the Illinois Life Co. which failed a number of years ago. Funeral arrangements were made by Mrs. Bessie Morgan Flick of Greeley, Iowa, who is a sister of the deceased.
