### Plans Completed for Lake Front Safety By Citizens Committee

Leo J. Sheridan, chairman of the Highland Park Lake Front Safety Comm. announces that final plans have been made for establishing life saving facilities on the lake front and that the equipment and special life boat now under construction in the ship yards of the Morton Johnson Co., at Bay Head, New Jersey will be delivered in Highland Park next month.

Several months were spent by the technical committee composed of expert yachtsmen, engineers and authorities including Hugh Reading, J. Byrne, Harry Earhart, E. J. Brown, E. J. Fucik, J. A. Peters, Albert Snite and Edw. L. Weeks in determining the most expert and practical manner of establishing facilities and launching. Fully appreciating that human life might depend on each detail and conscious of their responsibility to the community the committee reports that they consulted the United States Coast Guard and the Navy in each part of the plan and proceeded with their approval and advice.

The Lake Front Safety Comm. was organized last summer after the tragic death of a Highland Park man and his son and when in no less than eight others narrowly escaped drowning largely due to the fact that Highland Park was without any established or organized adequate life saving facilities. As the city was without funds or means of providing, a number of public spirited citizens met and decided to correct this condition.

Leo J. Sheridan was elected chairman and a finance committee composed of F. W. Chaffee, Jerome B. Bowes, Harry Earhart, Milton W. Stein and Hugh Reading proceeded to raise funds by private subscription and assisted by a general committee including F. P. Boynton, Robt. Roeber, J. Brent, L. Gourley, Maj. F. Roman, E. Gilroy, Sam. Hastings and a number of other
