

### Seeks Permanent Home For Works Of American Sculptor

"Living Faces" an editorial which appeared in the April 18th edition of the Saturday Evening Post is closely allied to Highland Park, in that the life masques referred to were the works of John H. J. Brower an American sculptor, whose great granddaughter, the late Mrs. Charles T. Boynton was a resident of this city.

Everett L. Millard, grandson of Mrs. Boynton recently completed a small booklet giving historic data regarding this great sculptor, who died before he had attained the goal he had worked for, (casting the masques into enduring bronze).

Brower died in 1834, requesting that this collection be boxed for forty years, by which time posterity might appreciate them and cast them into enduring bronze as he had hoped to do.

In 1885 several of these casts were sold by his son, while the remainder were stored in a corn crib outside Rome, N. Y. In 1924 Mrs. Boynton, came upon a few of them in an old stable in Evanston, and began the task of reassembling the collection. Included in the casts made by Brower were those of Thomas Jefferson, Marquis de La Fayette, Henry Clay, Presidents Adams, Jefferson, Madison and John Quincy Adams; Martin Van Buren, Dolly Madison, Charles Carroll, Commodore David Porter and Edwin Forrest.

Mrs. Boynton displayed her collection at the World's Fair in Chicago in 1933-35. At the present time these pieces of statuary are in Rosenwald museum. Donald S. Boynton, son of Mrs. Boynton and Mr. Millard are now seeking a permanent home for these masterpieces and Mr. Millard is at present in Washington in an effort to place them.

### Civil Service Seeks Card Punch Operator

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an open competitive examination for the position of alphabetic card-punch operator, \$1,280 a year. Applications will be accepted not later than May 15 if received from States east of Colorado, and not later than May 18 if received from Colorado and States westward.

Applicants must have had at least 2 months of full-time paid experi-

ence in operating card-punch machines. They must have reached their 18th but must not have passed their 33d birthday.
