The thousand odd club women throughout Illinois, delegates who will attend the state convention of the Illinois Federation of Womens Clubs, will be assembling wardrobes and making plans during the next two weeks for their trip to Chicago to attend this affair, which will occur on May 1, 2 and 3 at the Sherman hotel.

Leaders of the state federation have been working for several months preparing and assembling the program for the three-day meeting. Under the supervision of the state president, Mrs. William T. Bruckner of Hinsdale, the convention program committee, has planned a program to provide inspiration for the delegates and to send them back to their home communities armed with ideas.

Fields of thought, and equipped with renewed determination to uphold the high standards of individual and community life for which the federation has always stood.

"America—Which Way?—Adjusting Democracy to Humane Welfare" is the theme of the convention. Various phases of this theme will be discussed by the outstanding group of speakers secured by the committee.

Included in this group are, among others, such well-known men and women as Wilbur Helm, economist and civic leader; Dr. E. H. Reeder, authority on psychology from the University of Illinois; R. V. Flecher, of Washington, D. C., vice-president of the American Association of Railroads; Grace Morrison, immediate past president of the General Federation of Womens Clubs; Donald McGibney, news commentator; Dr. Frank N. Freeman, University of Chicago expert on educational psychology; Dr. Maude Slye, world famous for her work in cancer research; Dr. W. H. Judd, recently returned from ten years of medical practice in China; and Judge Malcolm Hatfield, na-

tionally known authority on juvenile delinquency.

To add variety to the meetings an excellent musical program has been prepared by Mrs. Adolf G. Hoffmann of Chicago, state music chairman, who, during the three days, will present many outstanding instrumental and vocal artists as well as a number of well-known choruses.
