### See Dream Realized If Congress Passes Ranspach Bill Now

In the present session of Congress, if the bill introduced by Representative Ranspach passes (H. R. 960), the League of Women Voters may see a dream they have had and for which they have worked for years, realized. Mrs. George G. Bogart, President of the League, said today in a letter which Mrs. I. Sigurd Johnson, President of the Highland Park League received as well as presidents of other local Illinois Leagues.

"The bill would bring practically all remaining government positions under the merit system—some 200,000 to 300,000 of them.

"The Ranspach bill provides that incumbents may continue to hold their jobs by qualifying in a non-competitive examination. This is the usual compromise between the interests of the 'ins' and the

"outs" by which, in recent years, most advances in the extension of civil service has been made.

"It is not to be expected that so far-reaching a bill would not incur opposition. Opposition is coming in the form of objections to what is dubbed the bill's blanket-in provision.

"Such opposition is unwarranted, in the League's belief. 'Blanketing-in' describes the procedure whereby incumbents are given classified standing under civil service without qualifying in any examination. The other extreme—the ideal way, theoretically—is that incumbents qualify in competitive examination, but this method represents no practical advantage as it is traditionally defeated by the majority party. The method in the Ranspach bill appears to be the wisest course."

Mrs. Bogart concludes with a request that local league presidents see that their representa-

tives in Congress are informed of their views on the bill.

### C. C. Kapschull Gets Road Building Job

The Illinois Division of Highways today announced the award of contracts aggregating \$189,354.18 for 0.72 miles of pavement approaches and construction of a subway at the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad and Route 21 on State Aid route 16 north of Mundelein in Lake County.

Kapschull and Company, Deerfield, was awarded a contract for pavement approaches on a bid of \$106,785.75; Eric Bolander Construction Company, Libertyville, concrete substructure and erection of structural steel, \$67,817.62, and A. F. Anderson Iron Works, Chicago, fabrication and delivery of steel, \$15,750.81.
