Examination for Government Service

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced open competitive examinations for the positions listed below. Applications must be on file with the Commission not later than May 22 if received from States east of Colorado, and not later than May 25 if received from Colorado and States westward.

Senior air safety investigator, \$4,600 a year, Air Safety Board, Civil Aeronautics Authority. Applicants must have had 2,000 hours' certified time as a pilot, and 10 years of certain specified experience in the field of aeronautics. Substitution of certain education for a part of the experience may be made.

Applicants must not have passed their fifty-third birthday.
Assistant librarian, \$3,600 a year, Department of Justice. Except for certain substitution, applicants must have completed a 4-year college course, 30 semester hours of training in library science, and 20 semester hours of study of law, all in schools of recognized standing. In addition they must have had certain experience in law-library work.
