

Four "Go Away Mad" Friday From Highwood Council Meeting

After three unsuccessful attempts to hold a council meeting, the Highwood City officials finally convened with a full quorum last Friday evening.

However the meeting did not last long, for four aldermen walked out when Mayor Charles Portilla refused to permit two of the aldermen to vote on a resolution setting the date for a contested election hearing.

The controversy involved a dispute over the election which was charged illegal because the Citizens party held no caucus prior to the April 18th City election. Ex-aldermen Richard Shannon and Evaristo Campagni, both defeated candidates of the 13th ward, contested the election.

Because this involved Alderman Pagdial and Calais, the Mayor contended they could not vote.

A resolution was adopted by Mayor Portilla, Aldermen George C. Kenry, Geano Piccoli and Edwin Cowgill calling for a hearing on May 31.

At a meeting held yesterday in the Highwood Council chambers, after considerable bickering, the meeting was adjourned to Saturday morning at ten o'clock.
