accepted by the council on a motion and vote.

A letter was read by the clerk to the council, from the City of Highland Park, Mich., inviting the city officials to attend the celebration commemorating the 50th anniversary of the City of Highland Park, Mich.

Police Ordinance

A police ordinance was passed by the council, the main purpose of which is to classify for liability purposes the various classes of those doing any kind of police work. Besides the regular police officers, there are to be provisional police—who are classified as police officers and not city employees and like police officers are not entitled to workmen's compensation in the event of injury, as are other city employees. The provisional police officers are special police, coming under civil service, employed for special work and paid on an hourly rate by the city while so employed. The third class provided for in the

ordinance are private policemen—this class is employed by a society, corporation or private individual to act as private watchmen and are agents of the individuals employing them and not an officer, employee or agent of the City of Highland Park.

Appointments
Commissioner Swanson re-appointed Mr. P. E. Cole as city engineer. This appointment was approved by the council.

Mr. F. G. Dennis asked if something couldn't be done by the council to get some action by the zoning board on his application for a building permit on his property located on Greenway road, near County Line road. He claimed that Mr. Reiser, chairman of the zoning board, had refused to take any action because he did not know his status, not having been re-appointed by the new council. The application has been on file since February first. Mayor Ronan stated that all committees remain the same until either resignation or new appointments are made. He said that he would get in touch with Mr. Reiser and the other members of the committee and ask them to serve and that Mr. Dennis could expect action by that group in the near future.

He had been a resident of Highwood for the past 15 years, coming there from Chicago where he had been engaged in the livery business for twenty-five years. Mr. Baker was born in Beaver Center, Pa.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Baker, and a daughter, Mrs. Ben Ginther, and a son, Howard Baker, both residents of Kingsbury, Ind.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning at 9:30 o'clock from St. James church, Highwood. Father Gleason officiated. Burial was in St. Mary's cemetery.

Sarah Louise Floyd Passes Away June 1

Sarah Louise Floyd, twin sister of Irene Floyd, passed away at her home, 300 Park avenue, Highland Park, on Thursday, June 1.

Services, conducted by the Rev. Christoph Keller, were held at the chapel, 27 North Sheridan road, at 3:30 p.m. Saturday, with interment at Lake Forest cemetery.

Miss Floyd was a member of a distinguished old Highland Park family whose home at 224 Central avenue had been a gathering place for early Highland Parkers as far back as 1890. She had lived in New York for 25 years, returning to Highland Park in 1933 where she had since remained with her sister.

During the World War Miss Floyd served overseas as a nurse with the United States Medical Corps and was attached to army

base hospitals at Vichy and Dijon in France. She was a member in New York of the Jane Delane Chapter of the American Legion.

The Corps was invited to take part by General John V. Clinan, president of the Non-Sectarian League for Americanism. This Flag Day Celebration will demonstrate Americanism and Tolerance. An interesting program has been planned including Historical Pageantry, Drill Teams, Folk Dances, Lancers, Choral Societies, and speakers.

Everyone who plans to attend is to meet at the City Hall in Highwood at 11 o'clock a.m. sharp. It has been arranged to have a police escort precede the cars to Soldier Field and back.

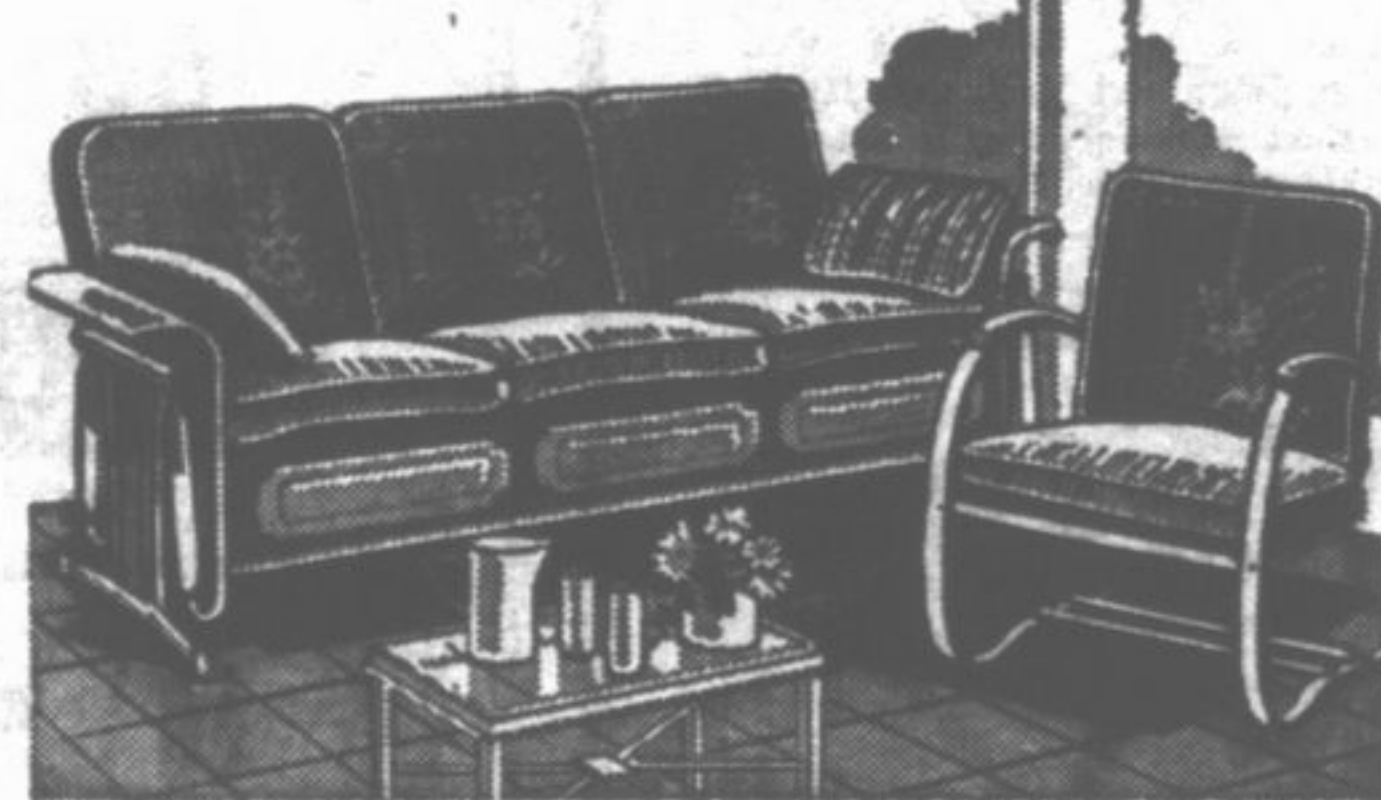

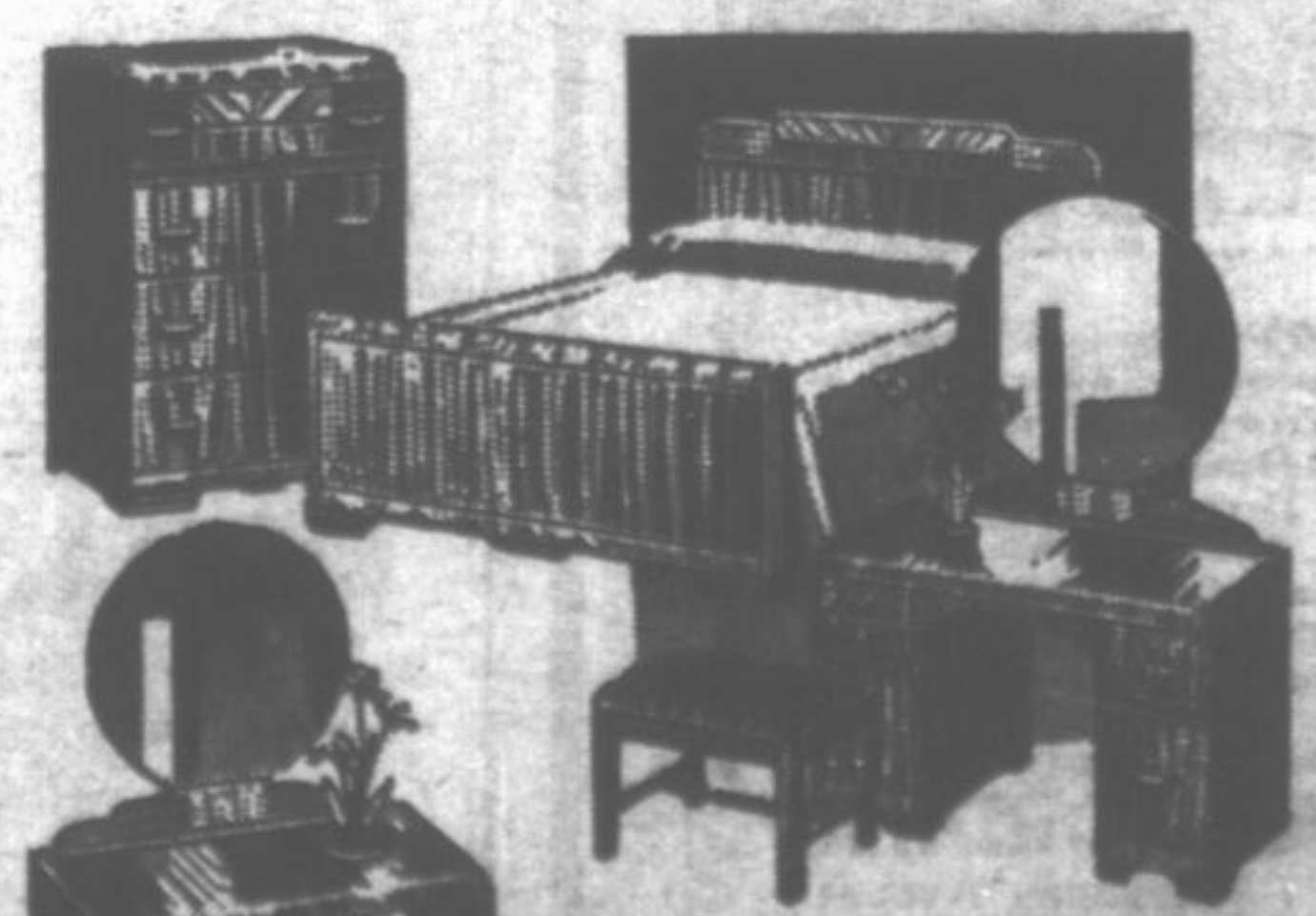
